As a result of the tips, revenue agent picked up \$9,977,846 more in taxes for the fiscal year which ended June 30.

All signs indicate this will be an even bigger year for informers, citizens pouring in tips on recurring revenue scandals are likely to uncover even more tax evasion.

In the past three years, payments to informers have averaged \$480,000 a year, a tremendous increase over former years.




