With a unique comb-razor you can thin out a bushy head of hair and whack off those fly-away locks with the skill of Jacques or Louis. It's quick and easy and keeps your poodle beautifully shaped and groomed.

A poodle is loveliest when it's lustrous. A good creame rinse after each shampoo, to make your hair shining-bright and so manageable that your pet hair-do may well be the poodle cut.
