

Care and Training, Pert Pet Poodles Made Easy



There probably hasn't been a hairdo in years as becoming to women of all ages as the Poodle. Teenagers love it and so do their mothers. To the young face it lends an air of pert sophistication; to the mature face it gives a fresh youthful look. But there are all kinds of poodles: long, short, soft and tight, wavy and winged. The most popular version is a short cut, about two inches all over featuring easy waves and soft curls.

The initial poodle cut should be done by an expert because thinning and shaping are so important. Unless your hair is naturally curly, you must have a permanent wave—probably as often as every two to three months.

The care and training of your Poodle is a simple matter. Run a comb through it a couple of times a day or brush it up, up, up. Keep a watchful eye on those little tendrils and back ends and learn how to trim these little stragglers. With a unique comb-razor you can thin out a bushy head of hair and whack off those flyaway locks with the skill of a Jacques or Louis. It's quick and easy and keeps your poodle beautifully shaped and groomed.

A poodle is loveliest when it's lustrous. A good creme rinse after each shampoo, to make your hair shine-bright and so manageable that your pet hair-do may well be the poodle cut.

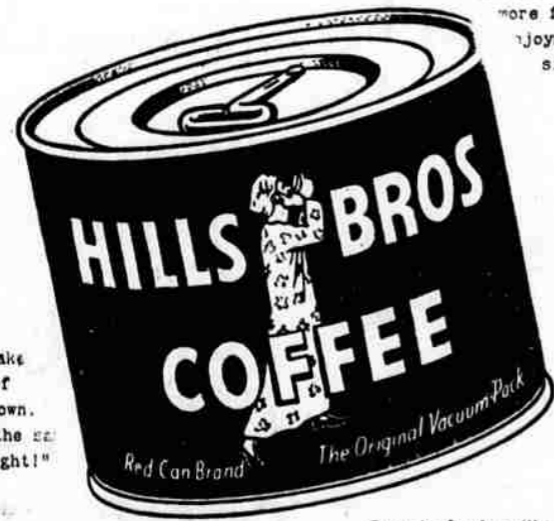
