Houbregs Aims For Record

By The Associated Press - Oregon's challenge for a share of second place and Bob Houbreg's bid for a scoring record spotlight the windup week-end of basketball in the Pacific Coast Conference's Northern Division.

Washington, with the title tucked safely away, ends the Division campaign in a Friday-Saturday series against Washington State in Seattle. Houbreg, the champs' lanky center, needs 47 points to beat the record of 205 set in 1940 by another Husky, Jack Nichols. Big Bob has averaged 19.9 per conference game.

Oregon must sweep its final series with Oregon State to finish in a tie for second with Idaho. The teams will play Friday night at Eugene and Saturday night at Corvallis.

Here, too, a scoring race will provide a sidelight. Capt. Ken Hunt of Oregon and Danny Johnston of OSC both will try to become the first "little man" in Northern Division history to score 200 points. Both are less than six feet tall.

Hunt, with 193, already has beaten the previous small-player record of 187 set in 1926 by Wally Palmberg of OSC. Johnston has 174 points. Except for the one season when the Division was expanded to include Montana, only 10 tall men have averaged 200 over the 16-game schedule.

Oregon will be favored to take both decisions, having trounced the cellar club twice in an earlier series. Washington also will be the favorite, although WSC holds one of two decisions against the Huskies this year in conference play. Idaho, the only team to beat Washington at the Seattle floor, has completed its Division schedule.

'Keed' Rallies For Victory

BOSTON, (AP) - Former Choir Singer Don Williams of Worcester, Mass., took everything Welterweight Champion Kid Gavilan could throw as the latter gained a divided decision in their 10-round non-title boxing bout Thursday night at the Boston Garden.

Spotting Gavilan one and three-quarter rounds at 147 1/2, Williams survived two first-round knockdowns and fought back so stubbornly that the bout was even going into the finale. The "Keed" from Cuba had to put on a furious final burst to sway Referee Tommy Ravson and Judge Joe Santapio in his favor.
