

He testified, however, that he had urged Mr. Truman at that time to have American policy toward China reviewed by advisers who had not been associated either with the formulation or carrying out "of that policy as recently practiced."

McCarthy Is **Center Of New Storm**

WASHINGTON in — An election year storm appeared to be brewing Thursday over whether to continue an inquiry into a demand that Sep. McCarthy (R.-Wis.,) be ousted from Congress.

Sen. Welker (R.-Idahe) called a move for a Senate vote on the question "pure politics." He said the administration is trying to prevent re-election of McCarthy this fall. McCarthy agreed.

However, Sen. Gillette (D.-Ia., declared "There is nothing more certain than the fact there is no political motive of any kind behind this move."

Gillette is chairman and Welker a member of a Senate rules sub-committee which voted 4-1 Wednes-day to try for a Senate decision on whether the group should go ahead with its months-old investigation


