WASHINGTON (AP) - Owen Lattimore testified Wednesday that in June 1945, he tried to influence President Truman against restricting American aid to the Chinese Nationalists while the Chinese Nationalists were also fighting the Japanese.

Lattimore, Far Eastern Affairs specialist, made the concession that he tried to "influence" the President under hammering questioning by Sen. Ferguson (R-Mich.).

"I have never had any influence on American foreign policy," Lattimore said at one point.

Ferguson refused to accept this. "I am not willing to have you draw the conclusion that you had no influence whatever on American policy," Ferguson said. "That is an issue before this committee."

Lattimore also denied that he had asked Mr. Truman in July of 1945 not to appoint Joseph C. Grew, ex-ambassador who is now retired, as an adviser on Far Eastern policy.

He testified, however, that he had urged Mr. Truman at that time to have American policy toward China reviewed by advisers who had not been associated either with the formulation or carrying out of that policy as recently practiced.

Lattimore was questioned for the eighth day by the subcommittee in its probe for any Communist influences on U.S. policies in the Far East.

**Ragpicker Is Wealthy Man**  
TORONTO (AP) - Alvin Poser was a dirty, ragged, ragpicker who lived alone in a squalor. He used to bring money into a trust company for deposit and some of the employees there tried to avoid waiting on him.

So he kept coming to George Ernest Buchanan, an executive of the company, who believed in "treating every customer as best I know how."

The old ragpicker, aged 70, died 11 days ago. He left \$25,000 - \$15,000 of it to Buchanan, the will disclosed Wednesday.

Buchanan said Poser came to the trust company in 1918 with \$5,000. Aided by Buchanan's investment advice, it grew to \$25,000.

The banker said he hadn't seen the old man for four years. "The shape of his hands told me he must have been a cultured man," Buchanan said. "They were the hands of an artist, once he washed them."

# McCarthy Is Center Of New Storm

WASHINGTON (AP) - An election year storm appeared to be brewing Thursday over whether to continue an inquiry into a demand that Sen. McCarthy (R-Wis.) be ousted from Congress.

Sen. Welker (R-Idaho) called a move for a Senate vote on the question "pure politics." He said the administration is trying to prevent re-election of McCarthy this fall. McCarthy agreed.

However, Sen. Gillette (D-Ia.) declared "There is nothing more certain than the fact there is no political motive of any kind behind this move."

Gillette is chairman and Welker a member of a Senate rules subcommittee which voted 4-1 Wednesday to try for a Senate decision on whether the group should go ahead with its month-old investigation

of ouster charges made against McCarthy by Sen. Benton (D-Conn.). McCarthy has challenged the subcommittee's authority to conduct the inquiry.

Gillette said the Wisconsin Republican had "impugned the integrity" of the members by charging the group was spending "tens of thousands of dollars of the taxpayers" to provide the Democrats with political ammunition to use against McCarthy.

The subcommittee voted to ask the Senate to decide whether there is any basis for McCarthy's charges—in effect a request for a vote of confidence and a decision whether the inquiry should be continued.

**Mahoney Pleads Innocent To Count**  
OREGON CITY (AP) - State Sen. Thomas Mahoney, accused of assault and battery, pleaded innocent in District Court here Wednesday.

Wayne Hull, a taxi driver, said Mahoney pushed him during an argument last week over a 50-cent cab fare.

Mahoney's plea was filed by another lawyer.

# Vet Joins Ranks For Farm Vote

YAKIMA (AP) - A Yakima man who lost most of his possessions in the Kansas floods, in the final round will compete with 50 other candidates for the Columbia Basin's farm-in-a-day.

He is Donald D. Dunn, who was chosen to represent this state in Washington, D. C., in the final national competition. The other candidates are being selected from the other states and the territories.

Dunn's selection was announced by H. B. Rosencrans, chairman of the state and national Veterans of Foreign Wars agriculture committees.

Dunn, who virtually was wiped out in the Kansas floods, now is a farm machinery salesman in Yakima. He has a wife and two children. He was a tank driver in the European theater during World War II.

Dunn won the local competition, then he was selected from approximately 1,600 entries from posts throughout the state.

The \$50,000 farm for which he is competing is to be built three miles from Moses Lake, Washington. It will be constructed and awarded May 29 to the man chosen as the nation's most worthy veteran.

The award will coincide with Columbia Basin celebrations opening the million-acre project to irrigation.

The men who served on the committee which selected Dunn to represent this state were Sverre Ohm-dahl, state director of agriculture; Henry Carstensen, master of the State Grange and James Johnston, vice president of the State County Agents' Association.

**2820 Apply For New Farm Project**  
EPHRATA, Wash. (AP) - Applicants for the nine Columbia Basin farm units to be sold after a public drawing March 14 face odds of 313 to one against them.

The Bureau of Reclamation said Wednesday that 2,820 applications have been received for the units, seven of which will receive water this year and the other two in 1953. Virtually without any hope at all are 197 applicants who are non-veterans. The veterans get first chance.

**Banking Conference To Be Held Soon**  
SPOKANE (AP) - The 13th Annual Pacific Northwest Banking Conference in Pullman April 11 will be addressed by Secretary of the Treasury John Snyder, the conference chairman announced Wednesday.

Joel Ferris, the chairman, said Snyder has agreed to address the final banquet of the two-day conference.

**Fourth Victim Of Crash Dies**  
NOME, Alaska (AP) - A Feb. 27 plane crash claimed its fourth victim Wednesday when Emil Fisher, 57, died of injuries.

Fisher was head of the Nome office of the Alaska National Bank. Others injured fatally in the crash-up near here were Reggie Joule, veteran bush pilot, his bride of a month, and Bill Porter, an airline mechanic.
