Park Service Men Retire

WASHINGTON (AP)—Retirement of one veteran National Park Service official and transfer of five others is announced by Secretary of the Interior Chapman.

Superintendent Ernest P. Leavitt of Crater Lake National Park in Oregon will retire March 14 after nearly 42 years with the Park Service.

John B. Wosky, assistant superintendent of Yosemite National Park in California will succeed him.

Harmon L. Bill, now assistant superintendent of Mt. Rainier National Park in Washington, will succeed Wosky. Curtis K. Skinner, chief park ranger at Yellowstone National Park in Wyoming, Montana and Idaho, will become assistant superintendent at Mt. Rainier.

Last Of Rail Strikes End

ELKHART, Ind. (AP)—The last holdout against court and union orders to end the New York Central Railroad strike went back to work Thursday.

The first switch engine crews started making up trains within an hour after the Elkhart strikers voted to end their walkout late Wednesday night. Fifty men were back on the job, and others were due back throughout the day.

A company spokesman in Chicago said operations on the railroad's main line should be back to normal by midnight.

Elkhart members of the Engineers, Conductors and Firemen Brotherhoods were the last to give in to the back-to-work orders. Resentful but believing they voted late Wednesday night to return to their jobs. A spokesman said the vote was 136 to 72.

Their fellows rebels in Toledo, O. had ended their resistance several hours earlier by the much closer vote of 220 to 214.

MIDDLETOWN, N. C. (AP)—An eighth member of a family of 11 died late Wednesday of burns suffered in a fire which destroyed their home at Walker Valley, N.Y.

Harry Polhamus, 43-year-old lumberjack, died at Middletown Sanitarium.

His wife, Evelyn, 39, and six of their children, ranging in age from two to 12, died in the flames early Wednesday.

Klamath Adults Steady Workers For Girl Scouts

Editor's Note: Girl Scouts are celebrating the 40th anniversary of organization this week. The following is a brief history of Girl Scouts, national and local by Ella Redkey, executive director, Klamath area Girl Scout Council.

On March 12, 1912 the first Girl Scout troop made up of about eight girls was organized by Juliette Low. In these 40 years, Girl Scouting has grown to a membership of 1,770,000 in the United States. Girl Scouting includes girls from 7 to 18, at 18 a girl may become an assistant leader and at 21 a leader of a group of girls. There is a place in Girl Scouting for adults (men and women) as well as girls.

The ideals behind Girl Scouting are expressed in the Girl Scout Promise and Laws. "On my Honor, I will try to do my duty to God and my country, to help other people at all times, to obey the Girl Scout Laws, The Girl Scout laws:

- A Girl Scout's Honor is to be trusted.
- A Girl Scout is loyal.
- A Girl Scout's duty is to be useful and to help others.
- A Girl Scout is a friend to all and a sister to every other Girl Scout.
- A Girl Scout is courteous.
- A Girl Scout is a friend to animals.
- A Girl Scout obeys orders.

Atom Plane Now Planning

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Air Force disclosed Thursday it has boosted its program for development of fantastically fast atomic-powered flight with a new contract to Boeing Airplane Co. of Seattle.

It is the second contract of its type to be announced by the Air Force and indicates the program of atomic flight is well into its second phase—that of blueprinting and experimental production.

Atomic power could give an airplane almost limitless range—80 times around the globe on one pound of uranium "fuel," some experts say—and speeds of 3,500 miles an hour and up.

But most experts say it's still a long-time project, with the first flyable atomic plane a matter of years—and many millions of dollars—away.

One said it probably would take "some what longer" than the estimated two or three years needed to complete the nuclear-powered submarine which the Navy has announced it is building.

Boeing is working presumably on the airframe, or shell, of a plane to be fitted around an atomic engine now being developed by Pratt & Whitney Aircraft Co., East Hartford, Conn. The Pratt & Whitney contract was announced last December.

Teamsters Picket Plant

WENATCHEE (AP)—Chelan County Superior Court Judge Fred Kemp Wednesday night issued a temporary order restraining AFL Teamsters' Union Local 148 from picketing the 50 million dollar Aluminum Company of America project near here.

The injunction was sought by the Tide Electric Co., Tacoma, contractors on the project, when the teamsters began picketing the plant in a dispute with electricians.

Judge Kemp ordered the union to appear in court March 18 to show cause why the injunction should not be made permanent.

Most workers refused to cross picket lines set up Wednesday but Tide Co., electricians stayed on the job.

Escaped Trusty Nabbed At Medford

SALEM (AP)—A trusty who walked away from the state prison annex Feb. 29 was arrested by state police at Medford Wednesday.

He was identified as George Frederick, 28, who was serving a three-year term for larceny in Umatilla County.

He walked away from the annex with Walter H. Edmonds, who was caught at Oceanside, Calif., earlier this week.
