Superintendent Ernest P. Leavitt of Crater Lake National Park in Oregon will retire March 14 after nearly 42 years with the Park Serv-

ice.
John B. Wosky, assistant super-intendent of Yosemite National Park in California will succeed

him.

Harthon L. Bill, now assistant superintendent of Mt. Rainier National Park in Washington, will succeed Wosky. Curtis K. Skinner, chief park ranger at Yellowstone

National Park, in Wyoming, Mon-tana and Idaho, will become as-sistant superintendent at Mt. Rai-nier.

WASHINGTON A — The Air Force disclosed Thursday it has boosted its program for development of Intrastically fast atomic powered flight with a new contract to Boeing Airplane Co. Seattle.

It is the second contract of its type to be announced by the Air Force and indicates the program of atomic flight is well into its second phase—that of biteprinting and experimental production.

Atomic power could give an airplane almost limitless range—80 times around the globe on one pound of uranium "fuel." some experts say—and speeds of 2,500 miles an hour and up.

But most experts say it's still a long-time project, with the first flyable atomic plane a matter of years—and many millions of dollars—away.
