### CEILINGS DUE

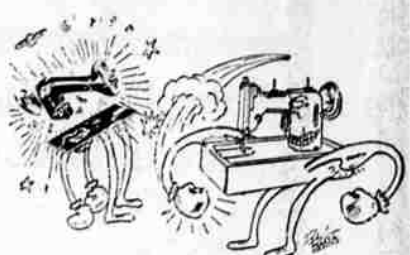
WASHINGTON (AP)—Ceiling prices on West Coast fir and hemlock lumber are due for announcement before nightfall Thursday.
