CHIEFTAINS NIP POWERS

Records Fall In Openers

SALEM (AP) — Western Oregon teams dominated the field Thursday in the highest scoring Class B high school basketball tournament Oregon has ever seen.

Three teams from east of the Cascade Range were knocked out of title play in the fast-paced opening rounds Thursday. There were four games, and three of them topped all previous scoring records.

Knappa from Northwest Oregon set the fastest pace, downing Culver, 73-62. Sublimity edged Echo, 61-58. Mapleton defeated Willows, 67-54, and Rogue River downed Powers, 43-42.

Only the Rogue River-Powers game failed to top the previous tourney record of 111 points in a game.

Knappa's 73 points gave it the single-game scoring record. The old mark was 69, established by Pleasant Hill in 1946.

In title play Rogue River meets Mapleton and Sublimity plays Knappa Friday night.

Mapleton, an inland Lane county team that somehow has acquired the nickname of Sailors, had just too tight a defense for Willows from Eastern Oregon. It was never close after the first quarter.

Sublimity and Echo matched fast breaks, with Sublimity gaining the edge. With five minutes to go Sublimity held a 16-point margin. Echo tried valiantly then, but could cut only 13 points off that margin before time ran out.

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — Middleweight Champion Sugar Ray Robinson successfully started his series of monthly title fights by decisively defeating Carl (Bobo) Olson of Honolulu Thursday night.

The tap dancing master of the 160 pound division had to travel at top speed to score a 15 round unanimous decision over his younger rival.

He next defends against Rocky Graziano in Chicago April 16 and against Paddy Young in New York May 16.

Robinson, obviously tired after exchanging punches with the rugged 23-year old Honolulu-born fighter, said he finished in good condition.

Proceeds went to the Damon Runyon Cancer Fund. Robinson contributed his purse, except \$1.

Hoop Field Complete For NCAA Tourney

CHICAGO (AP) — The National Collegiate Athletic Association's basketball championship field of 16 was complete Friday with the addition of four eastern schools...

The 16 conference titleholders include Kentucky, the defending champion and top-ranked team in the country in the Associated Press poll this season, and Illinois, the nation's No. 2 team in the AP poll.

Four regional tournaments, with four teams each, will be held Mar. 21-22. The winners of these meets qualify for the championship finals at the University of Washington, Seattle, Mar. 25-26.

The regional meets will be held at Raleigh, N. C., Chicago, Kansas City and Corvallis, Ore.

Howard Hobson, Yale University basketball coach who served on the Selection Committee which picked the four eastern schools, said at New Haven he did not agree with the choices.

Pilots Upset Hamline, Face Murray in Semis

KANSAS CITY (AP) — There'll be a new champion in the 14th National Intercollegiate Basketball Tournament for sure and the winner will have beaten the best field ever assembled for the six-day small college meet.

The Portland (Ore.) University Pilots took care of the new champion Hamline University of St. Paul, Minn., 75-67 in the quarterfinals to the delight of 8,000 fans Thursday night.

The Pilots, who came to the tournament with a 21-9 record, will meet Murray (Ky.) State (23-9) in the semifinal feature Friday night. Murray State dumped Whitworth College of Spokane 81-69, but failed to stop the losers' tall Ralph
