


coos BAY (A — A lumber camp waitress drowned Sunday night when the car she was driving plunged into the Coos River, eight

NEW YORK (A — Walter Win-chell became ill just before air time last night and did not make his usual weekly broadcast over the American Broadcasting Com-pany network.

Winchell's remarks, as he had prepared them, were read by Richard Stark, who usually announces the program.

The 54-year-old columnist's office said later that Winchell "against the advice of his doctors and the protest of Mrs. Winchell, prematurely returned to his work following a serious attack of virus infection."

"He will duly resume after consultation with his physicians," the
statement added.

program. The Daily Mirror, which
