## Red Cross Drive Lags; Hope Held

Although the Klamath Red Cross funds drive is more than half over and less than the goal has been reached, officials and drive workers continue to be optimistic. However, their optimism is tempered with the thought that even the success of the lagging Rural Division is the key to attaining the \$25,000 goal.

Bad weather and tough travel conditions have seriously handicapped the Rural Division co-chairmen, Herb Pollard and Jim Emmons. The Klamath Red Cross directors, in special session yesterday, pondered Pollard and Emmons' problems and made plans to give them an assist.

As of this morning, the Rural Division had turned in but \$337 toward a quota of \$5,000.

Overall collections this morning totaled \$10,236, amounting to approximately 41 per cent of the \$25,000 goal.

This is how the six divisions of the drive shaped up this morning: Advanced gifts, quota \$2,500, collections \$1,700, 68 per cent; Residential, quota \$2,500, collections \$1,621, 65 per cent; Industrial, quota \$4,500, collections \$2,609, 60 per cent; Special Groups, quota \$2,900, collections \$950, 48 per cent; Business, quota \$4,500, collections \$2,889, 64 per cent; and Rural, quota \$5,000, collections \$378, 8 per cent.

This year's drive is running substantially ahead of last year's, with collections almost \$2,000 ahead of the same time last year. Faye Smith, regional Red Cross field representative, told the directors yesterday she believed the drive here was progressing as favorably as drives in other area chapters. She praised the directors for their active interest in pushing the drive.
