TOKYO to — Hundreds of American servicemen married Japanese girls Wednesday—just in time to beat the deadline for taking their petite brides home to the United States.

James B. Pilcher, U.S. consul general, estimated the last-day rush of civil ceremonies at six consular offices increased the number of servicemen legally married to Japanese to about 8,000.
