

Hopes For More Meat Fade As Spring Planting Survey Shows Farmers Cutting Area

WASHINGTON (AP)—Government hopes for more meat, dairy and poultry products during the next 18 months were dimmed Thursday when a spring planting survey showed farmers plan to cut down on acreage, rather than increase planting as recommended by Secretary of Agriculture Brannan.

The Agriculture Department said farmer concern over a tight labor supply, recent downturns in farm product prices, and a desire to keep much land in grass for grazing beef cattle were factors holding down planting.

Particularly disappointing from the government's standpoint were prospects that the acreage of livestock feed grains will be less than last year. A sharp increase had been urged because reserves of these grains have dwindled sharply since start of the Korean war.

The department said the outlook "does not augur well" for increased livestock production. It expressed the hope, however, that acre yields will be large enough to produce grain crops which would permit maintenance of livestock products close to current levels.

For sugar beets, the indicated acreage is about one-sixth less than the acreage which would produce the beet sugar quota.

Movieland Waits For Big Academy Award Show

HOLLYWOOD (AP)—Anybody who is anybody in movieland will be present Thursday night for the 24th annual Academy Awards — except some of the people voted most likely to win.

At least 12 of the 25 top nominees won't be on hand. Vivien Leigh and Marlon Brando, choice of the Associated Press poll and most other experts for the coveted top actress and actor Oscars, are out of town.

Both were nominated for roles in "Streetcar Named Desire." But right now Miss Leigh is on the New York stage with her husband, Laurence Olivier, and Brando is in France to do a movie. Katharine Hepburn, Humphrey Bogart's co-star in "African Queen," is en route to London and

won't be among those present. Montgomery Clift of "Place in the Sun" will be the only other top male star present. He's planning to return New York. Fredric March of "Death of a Salesman" could be another sentimental choice. A victory for him would make him the only three time winner. He's in New York. Arthur Kennedy of "Bright Victory" is in Jamaica.

The closest battle is between "Streetcar" and "Place in the Sun" for the best picture sweepstakes. It's worth \$1,000,000 added to the boxoffice for the winner of the best picture plums.

MGM's double entry of "Quo Vadis" and the musical "American in Paris" are not figured to upset. The nearest thing to a sure bet is George Stevens for the best direction. His "Sun" was tabbed a director's picture from the start.

Trip Taken, Boss Fired

MERLIN, Ore. (AP)—School Principal Royal A. Ivory brought his 16 students home Wednesday to find he was fired.

It was his latest trip — Ivory and the students' parents took the youngsters on a four-day trip to San Francisco — that brought about his discharge.

Mrs. C. A. Axtell, chairman of the school board, said it wasn't the trip alone. That was just the latest thing, she indicated.

It was lack of co-operation on his part that led to the board's decision, she said. The board refused him permission to make this trip, the latest in a series he has conducted for students. The trip then was shifted from school time to spring vacation. It was financed by students and parents at this community, seven miles north of Grants Pass.

Some parents protested the board's action, and Mrs. Axtell said their petition to rehire Ivory would be considered next month.

Ivory, an advocate of visual education, took a group of students on a trip to the state legislature last year, where they attracted considerable attention.

New Bible To Be Printed Up

NEW YORK (AP)—Printing has begun on the revised standard version of the Holy Bible, the climax to a 15-year labor of love.

The printing of one million copies got under way Wednesday. They go on sale Sept. 30.

Spokesmen for the copyright owner—the National Council of the Churches of Christ in the U.S.A.—hailed it as one of the biggest projects in book publishing history.

For 15 years, 32 scholars worked on the new version, aiming at clearer language and truer accuracy than the widely used King James version that dates back to 1611.
