Delicious Orange Dishes Important Diet Need

Looking for a food bargain? Then look for the display of oranges in your local food market. This popular fruit is in good supply this month and should be one of the "good buys" for the economy minded homemaker.

Oranges play an important part in our daily diets—we often start the day right with a glass or orange juice. They are grand to tuck into school lunch boxes, combine beautifully with other fruits and foods for salads, and lend their refreshing fruity flavor to a host of delicious desserts.

Oranges are one of the best sources of Vitamin C. This vitamin is so important for good health and protection against disease. We need to replenish our supply each day so it is not stored in the body as some vitamins are.

To brighten up Lenten menus, yet keep the budget in line, orange salads and desserts will bring a breath of spring to your dinner table.

SPRING BLOSSOM SALAD
1 Tbsp. plain gelatin
1/2 cup fresh lemon juice
1/4 cup sugar

1 1/4 cups fresh orange juice
1 pint cottage cheese.
Soften gelatin in lemon juice. Heat orange juice and sugar; dissolve gelatin mixture in hot juice. Add 1/2 cup of this mixture to cottage cheese; set aside. Pour remaining gelatin-juice in ring mold. Chill until almost set; spread cottage cheese on top. Chill until firm. Unmold on platter and decorate with orange slices, avocado slices, salad greens or berries.

ORANGE TORTE (Serves 8)
1 orange
1/2 cup shortening
1 cup brown sugar

1 egg
1 cup sifted all-purpose flour
1/2 tsp. soda
1/4 tsp. salt
1 cup buttermilk
1 cup seedless raisins
1/2 cup all bran

Grate rind from orange. Squeeze juice (1-3 cup). Cream shortening and sugar well. Add egg and beat until light and fluffy. Sift together flour, soda and salt; add to the creamed mixture alternately with buttermilk and orange juice. Add orange rind, raisins and all bran. Pour into 9-inch square pan. Bake in moderate oven 350 F., 45 to 50 minutes. Serve warm with whipped cream.

Orange Marshmallow Surprise
3 slightly beaten eggs
1/4 cup sugar
1/2 tsp. salt
2 cups milk, scalded
1/2 tsp. vanilla
6 marshmallows
1 Tbsp. grated orange peel
Combine eggs, sugar, and salt; slowly add milk and vanilla. Pour over marshmallows in individual custard cups. Sprinkle with grated orange peel. Set in pan containing 1 inch hot water. Bake in moderate oven, 325 F., 30 to 40 minutes, until inserted knife comes out clean.

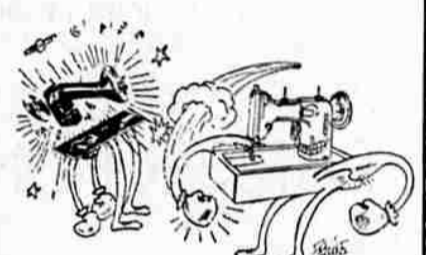
