

Hospital Inmate Loses Appeal

PORTLAND (AP)—A former inmate of the state hospital Monday lost his suit against the state of Oregon.

He is Vern L. Rathkey who contended he was confined to the hospital without due process of law. Federal Judge Gus J. Solomon dismissed the suit saying he could find no basis for action against former Governor Charles Sprague and John Hall.

Rathkey, who acted as his own counsel, asked and was granted permission to appeal. Judge Solomon warned Rathkey, however, that rules of appeal are extremely complicated.

Deal Asked On Car Payment

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Federal Reserve Board was asked Monday to give West Coast residents an extra three months to pay for their automobiles.

Rep. Mack (R-Wash.), made public a letter to the board in which he said present credit regulations—one-third down and 18 months to pay—adds from \$12 to \$20 a month to payments of West coast residents over those of purchasers further east who do not have to pay the high freight costs. The result, Mack wrote, is that new car sales have fallen off in Oregon, Washington and California far faster than elsewhere in the country.

He proposed that the board ease the westerners 21 months in these states to pay off.

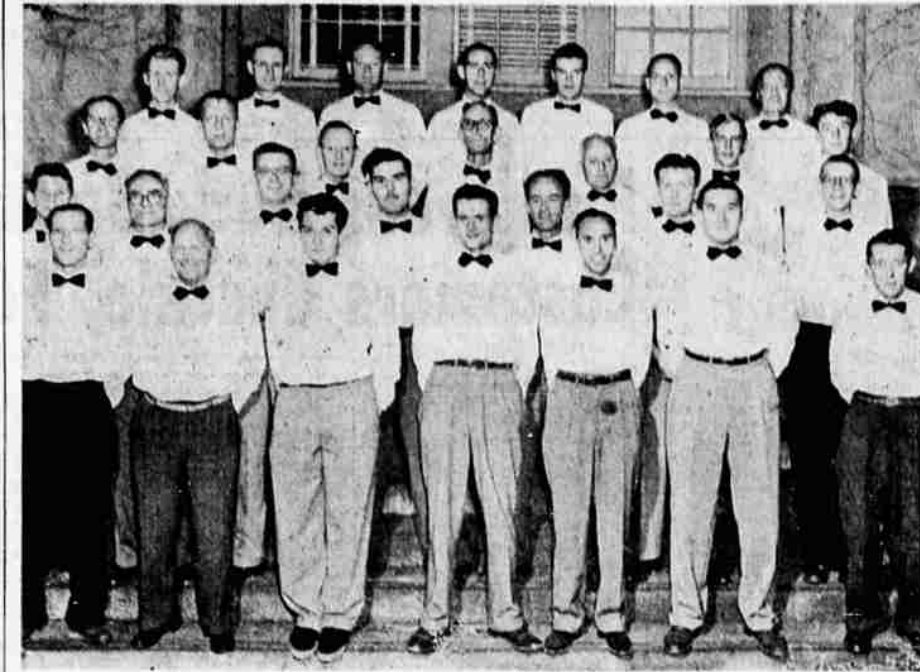

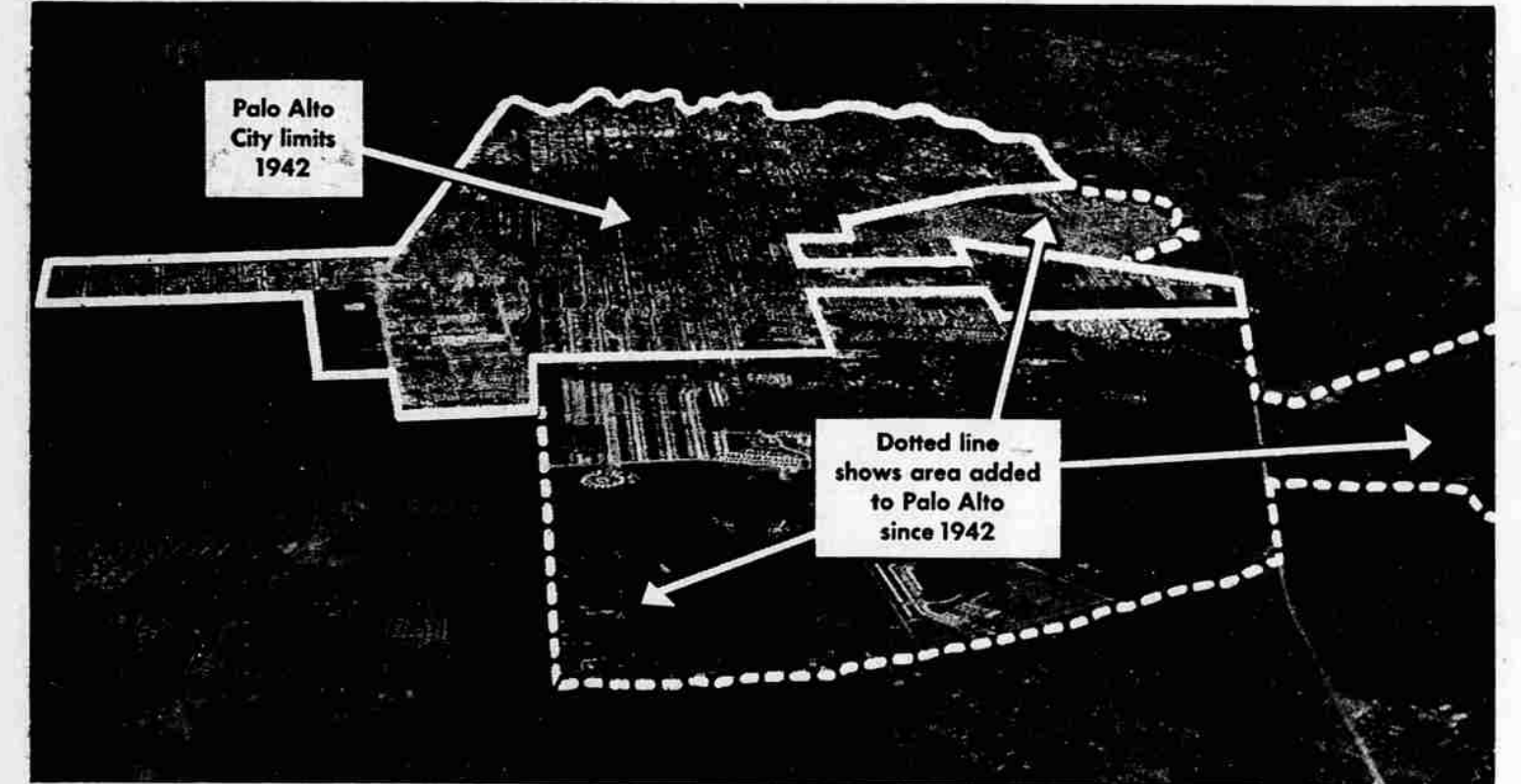

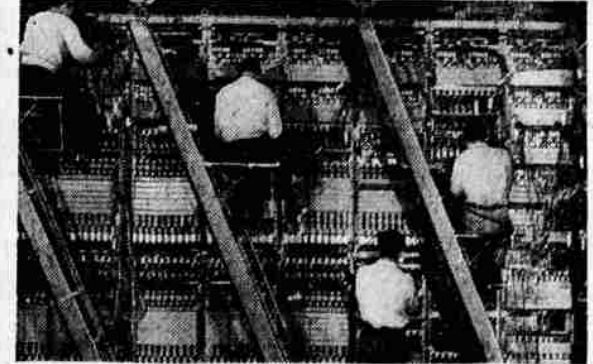
