Police Pay Scale Proposal Speaker At OTI Would Up Salary; Create Office Of Captain, Others

A suggested pay scale for the Klamath Falls police department to provide more money for most ranks as well as more incentive for career men was drawn up Monday by the Civil Service Commission.

The proposal was turned over to the City Council's police committee for study.


