Tetany Check Watch Needed

Feed hay daily and take cattle off pasture at night for two or three weeks as a preventative against grass tetany, advises Farm Advisor Ken Baggett of Tulelake. The causes of this highly fatal disease of cattle are still obscure. Baggett reports, but it often occurs about two weeks after livestock are put on lush pastures.

Grass tetany is believed to be the result of too little magnesium in the feed, the farm advisor says. However, it is probably more than just a simple magnesium deficiency since grass is a good source of magnesium.

Dry cattle or dairy cattle are not affected as much as beef cattle because they eat hay. Cattle that do not have hay available to them are more liable to come down with grass tetany than those that have hay daily. Legume and grass hay are rich in magnesium. Also cottonseed, linseed, soy bean meal, wheat middlings and beet pulp.

Symptoms of grass tetany are: nervousness, restlessness, muscle twitching, rolling of the eyes, frothing at the mouth, salivation, intense excitement, unsteady gait, erect ears, contraction of neck muscles, cramps, constant lowing, difficulty in getting up and down, and a tendency to run into fences, ditches, or barns. A cattleman will not observe all these symptoms of nervousness in one animal, but may notice several of them appearing in his herd as an indication of grass tetany.

Lake Meet April 5 To Show Irrigation Water Forecast

Final Oregon irrigation water for 1952 will be announced at a series of regional committee meetings beginning March 29 according to W. T. Frost, Oregon snow survey leader. Other committees and their scheduled meeting places and dates are: central Oregon at Redmond, March 31; John Day-Harney basin at Burns, April 1; Umatilla-Walla Walla at Pendleton, April 2; north-eastern Oregon at Enterprise, April 3; southeastern Oregon at Ontario, April 4; south central region at Lakeview, April 5; southern region at Grants Pass, April 7; and Columbia basin at Portland, April 11.

The statewide preliminary water supply outlook for Oregon is "good" to "excellent," Frost announced. Above normal snow cover is present in the mountains and March 1 records have been broken on 52 of 93 snow courses measured, he said.
