WASHINGTON IN — The State Department had milliarly support Wednesday in urging that this country wage an all-out war of ideas against the Communists and a "sinister" hate-Americans campaign.

"We can not do the job halfway," Gen. J. Lawton Collins, Army chief of staff, told a House Appropriations subcommittee. "We must go all out in the battle of idea. Only thus can we hope to convince potential aggressors that another war can not pay."


The proposed revision of Lane's government would replace the present three-man court with a seven-member council of elected representatives who would appoint a county manager.
