CHICAGO (U) — Failure of a slight uptick in mid-morning to stir up any follow through buying caused grains to reverse their trend on the board of trade Wednesday.

Wheat enjoyed a brief period of popularity. This helped steady the rest of the cereal list. Buying was based largely on small exports of corn and statistics which showed a further decline in locally held stocks of wheat.

NEW YORK (U) — The stock market pursued a narrow but steady course Wednesday but ended on a steady note.

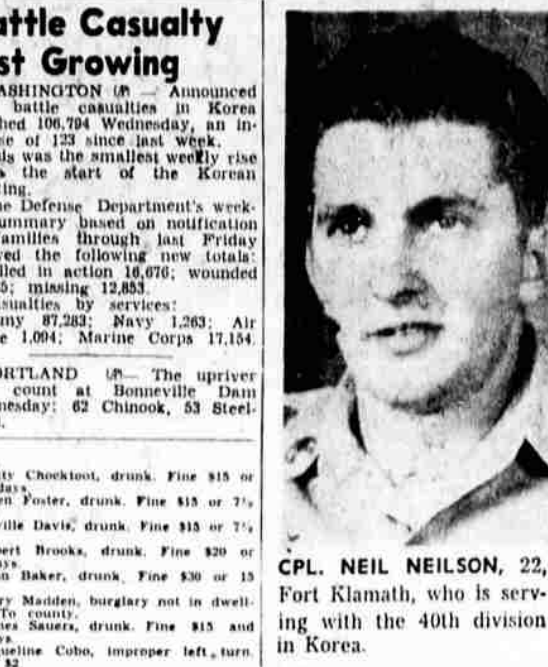
Battle Casualty List Growing
