A letter from D. H. Willis, business agent for the AFL, Oregon Public Employees Council, Portland, to County Judge Raymond Lathrop set the strike date for April 7 and said the Josephine County road shops would be picketed. The vote to strike was 28-1, Willis said. The dispute started March 12 when 30 of the county's 50 road workers said in a signed statement they felt they could no longer work under County Road Superintendent Roy Slette. They accused him of changing time cards, belittling workers and blaming them for unavoidable incidents. The workers asked a public hearing. The court refused the public hearing. Lathrop said the time cards had been changed in favor of the workers and that other complaints had been solved by a department reorganization. He said the court would hear any grievances from workers.

DP'S TRAPPED IN SHANGHAI
HONG KONG (AP)—An International relief organization official estimates there are more than 5,000 displaced persons still trapped in Communist Shanghai because no body wants them. Most of them are White Russians, according to IRO Special Envoy Thomas Jamieson.

The problem is to find countries economically capable of absorbing them, he said. Australia, Canada and the United States have taken in 440,000 displaced persons in the past few years while the United Kingdom took 80,000.
