Congressional Hearing On Hells Canyon Dam Project Hears Those Favoring Dam

WASHINGTON (AP)—A Congressional committee began hearing testimony Friday from a score of Idaho and Oregon residents favoring a bill to authorize Hells Canyon dam in the Snake River. Proponents of the government's plan to build a \$37-million-dollar dam on the Idaho-Oregon border, were scheduled to complete their testimony before the House Interior subcommittee during the day. Government officials testified Wednesday and Thursday, and opponents of the controversial bill also will be given three days. Committee members took so much time questioning Secretary of the Interior Oscar L. Chapman on the first two days of the hearing that 12 other government officials agreed to submit written statements instead of testifying. These were offered for Paul Raver, head of the Bonneville Power Administration; Harold T. Nelson, Boise, Idaho, Reclamation Bureau regional director, and other officials of the BPA, Reclamation Bureau, Park Service, Fish and Wildlife Service, Bureau of Mines and Bureau of Land Management. Raver's statement said Hells Canyon is a key project in the government's development program for the Columbia river basin. He said the project will produce power needed in the Pacific Northwest and will "provide new bases for job opportunities and for private investment, open up new avenues of industrial development, contribute to an improved standard of living for the people of the basin, promote the conservation of the river's resources and strengthen the nation's security and economic strength." "Alternate schemes" which have been proposed "would cause the full storage of Hells Canyon itself to be wasted and lost forever," Raver declared. He referred to plans of the Idaho Power Co., a leading opponent of the Hells Canyon project, to build five smaller dams in the river. The five sites would be flooded by Hells Canyon. Raver said Hells Canyon would add 1,100,000 kilowatts of power to the Columbia river system—about 500,000 kilowatts more than Idaho Power Company plan. Nelson said in his statement no direct irrigation would be possible from the Hells Canyon project but that Scraper Creek power facilities are an integral part of the Pavette

Unit of the Mountain Home reclamation project. The bill would authorize the \$2 million-dollar Scraper project, as well as Hells Canyon dam. In his statement filed with the committee, BPA Power Manager William A. Dittmer confirmed a statement made Thursday that the government had offered to sell Hells Canyon power to the Idaho Power Co. Reclamation Commissioner Michael W. Straus told the committee that Idaho Power Co. had not accepted the offer. Dittmer said the minimum of 300,000 kilowatts of power to be reserved for Idaho under the bill "should supply all needs in that area."

Posse Tracks Down Killer Of Three Neighbors, Kills Slayer In Hot Gun Battle

MERRIMAN, Neb. (AP)—Grim Nebraska ranchers avenged the killing of three neighbors Thursday by cornering the gunman in a shed and firing bullet after bullet until the triple-slayer cried out: "I'm through. Come and get me!" The angry posse poured into the building and dragged out 32-year-old Elaine Ellis, still clutching his shotgun. Mortally wounded, Ellis gasped out the phrases "They bewled me out" and "Just the meanness in me." Officers said it was the dying man's admission that he killed Mr. and Mrs. George Mensinger and a neighbor, Deo Gardner, Thursday morning. Ellis formerly lived about two miles from the Mensingers. The posse opened fire after Ellis raised his gun as if to shoot. Mensinger, 28, was the operator of a 3,000 acre ranch five miles south of Merriman. He was killed by a shotgun blast through the doorway of his farm home. His wife, Elaine, 24, was wounded but reached a telephone and gave the alarm. Another shot killed her and wounded her 10-month-old baby. Gardner, 50, and another neighbor, Cliff McDonald, had started for the Mensinger ranch when they met the assailant. Gardner was killed by a pistol shot and McDonald wounded by a shotgun blast. Ranchers and townspeople helped comb the almost roadless sandhills with planes, jeeps, cars and horses. A posse of more than 100 cornered Ellis in a shed on the Andy Anderson ranch about six miles from Mensingers place.

Winchester Study Slated

REEDSPORT (AP)—A study began here Thursday of ways to end dangerous tides and currents in Winchester Bay, where 11 sports fishermen drowned last year. The Port of Umpqua and the Douglas County Court hired an engineering firm to make the study. There are two objectives: (1) to end present hazards and (2) to outline future recreational developments. Local residents have blamed the south jetty for much of the trouble. The jetty was built two years ago, intended to maintain the cargo shipping channel. Residents insist the jetty set up swift currents and channeled a ground swell into the bay. They blame this for a current eating away a bank on the north end of the bay, threatening homes there. County-owned land, intended as a beach boulevard, was washed away. Boat landings also have been damaged.

Pair Foiled In Jail Break Try

SALEM (AP)—Guards foiled a prison break attempt here Thursday, the second in two days. This time Alvis Odell Davis, 24, and David C. Johnson, 36, were found missing in a 5 p.m. cell check. A search uncovered them hiding in a pile of sawdust, still inside the walls. Both went into prison last year. Davis on a four-year term for burglary in Lane County. Johnson on a three-year term for obtaining money by false pretenses in Klamath County. The previous night four others, including the notorious John O. Pinson and Dupree Poe, were caught inside the walls in an attempted escape.
