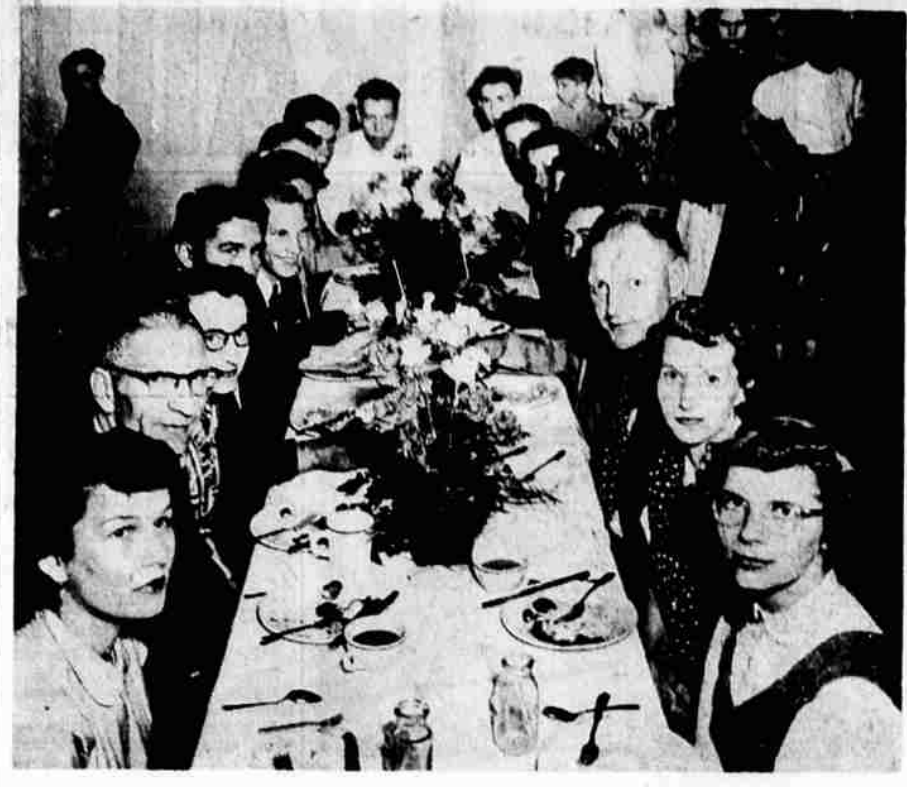

Floods Hit Midwest As Rivers Rise

Residents in five midwest states battled flood waters Wednesday as rivers and streams overflowed from spring thaws.
Cooler weather hit the flooded areas of the Dakotas, Minnesota, Wisconsin and Iowa Wednesday. Temperatures, however, generally were above freezing.
Flood waters from the Missouri river forced 60 families from their homes west of Williston, N. D., while more than 200 homes were affected by the overflow of the swollen Little Missouri river in Marmarth, N. D. Floods were expected along other rivers in North Dakota.
The Missouri also was overflowing at Fort Pierre, S. D., covering about 10 residential blocks. The Bad river, south of Fort Pierre,

also was over its banks, with water five deep over 10 or 15 homes.
The Root, Redwood and Minnesota rivers caused extensive damage in Minnesota, while several families were forced from their homes in the Springdale section of Sioux City, Ia., by the flooding Floyd River.
The Oconto River spilled over its banks in Oconto, Wis.
Cooler weather was reported from the Appalachians westward through most of the Great Lakes region and the Ohio Valley. It was below freezing in most of the northern plains states.

GI Death Laid To Natural Cause

SEATTLE (AP) — The death of an Army sergeant aboard the troopship *Argo* was due to natural causes, the Army reported Tuesday.
Master Sgt. John J. Galkowski of Chicago, a Korean War veteran, died after a shore-leave scuffle with other soldiers at Honolulu. Ten soldiers were taken off the *Argo* and held for questioning in connection with the death, Army officials said, but were released after an autopsy showed Galkowski died of a heart ailment and a cerebral hemorrhage.
Officers of the *Argo* reported the incident when the troopship docked here from the Far East Tuesday.

Probe Ordered In Death Fall

PORTLAND (AP) — An investigation of the death of Donald A. McPherson, who died after a seven-story plunge from the Medical Arts Building was continued here Wednesday.
Several persons saw McPherson, a 62-year-old resident of Clatskanie fall past their windows. But how he came to plunge from the building was undetermined.
It was learned he had been under medical care for some time and had gone into the building for a prescription.

Ike Report Draws Praise

PARIS (AP) — Most European editorial writers praised Gen. Eisenhower Wednesday for his annual SHAPE report, and agreed that it formed a policy statement for his campaign to get the Republican presidential nomination.
The report, said the independent Welt of Hamburg, "is probably the initial policy statement of a favorite presidential candidate."
The London Times termed the report "a tribute to Gen. Eisenhower's sound common sense and grasp of essentials," and added that "certainly Europe has, for the second time, a debt of gratitude to pay this unusual soldier who handles nations as easily as divisions and has a burning faith in this mission."
The London Daily Worker, a Communist newspaper, headed its story: "U.S. Governor of Europe Eisenhower presents report."
It said the report "reads like a report of a mid-Victorian viceroy of India describing the behavior of potentates and people in the subject provinces under his control."
French morning newspaper mainly published the story on inside pages without comment.
In London the conservative Daily Graphic said the report is "one of the most momentous statements on war and peace that this generation has heard."
Most British newspapers played up the economic angles of the report.
The Liberal News Chronicle said the report was "encouraging," but added that Eisenhower does not seem to worry as much about military aspects as economic.

Oldster Dies In Porch Wreckage

MCGRORY, Ark. (AP) — The rotted porch of an old abandoned home near here was a death trap for an 86-year-old man.
John Russell mounted the porch Sunday to seek shelter from a shower. The flimsy flooring gave way and he fell through. The jagged boards held him fast.
His body was found Tuesday. A physician said death was due to exhaustion or a heart attack.

Red MIG Shot Down Over Korea

SEOUL, Korea (AP) — U.S. Sabre pilots Wednesday destroyed one MIG-15 and damaged two others of a Chinese Communist Air Force that showed little desire to fight after the tough handling it got Tuesday.
The Air Force raised Tuesday's MIG casualty total by two more damaged, confirmed after evaluation of gun camera films. These raised the day's total to 10 MIGs destroyed and 12 damaged.
It was the second biggest daily bag of the war for the Sabre pilots.
Capt. Robert T. Latshaw of Amarillo, Tex., knocked the Red jet down in a 10-minute fight between 33 Sabres and about 30 MIGs over North Korea just before dusk.
Wednesday's two damage claims came out of a brief encounter in the morning. Pilots said they thought they hit a third MIG in this fray.
Sabre pilots traded shots with MIG flyers at other times during the day but the MIGs dodged back into their Manchurian sanctuary rather than fight.
The U.S. Fifth Air Force said the Red airmen failed to show up in force anywhere on Wednesday.
On the ground, a U.S. Eighth Army briefing officer reported only two Communist probes and scattered patrol skirmishes along the Korea battlefield Wednesday morning.
Counter-attacking Allied troops Tuesday night and early Wednesday hurried back about 1,500 Chinese Reds who hit United Nations lines on the western front four miles from the Panmunjon truce tents.
The Navy announced that the American Carrier Boxer returned to Korean waters for its third tour of duty. Planes from the Boxer and the U.S. Carriers Philippine Sea and Valley Forge pounded Red targets on the East Coast.
