Draftees OK Bus Strike
SAN FRANCISCO—The month old Pacific Greyhound bus strike may be amending to thousands in seven affected Western states but there have been no complaints from prospective draftees in California.
In Marin County, Mrs. Georgia Byron, county draft board clerk, said the buses were the only means of mass transportation, and without them draftees could not be taken to San Francisco for induction. The county draft call was cancelled for April.
And State Selective Service Director James H. Leitch said the same policy will apply for other areas served only by Greyhound.

Portland To Hear Kefauver Speech
PORTLAND (AP)—Sen. Estes Kefauver, Democratic presidential candidate, will speak here next Thursday night, State Sen. Jack Bain, his Oregon campaign manager, said Thursday.
Kefauver also has tentatively accepted an invitation to share the speakers' platform with Gov. Adlai Stevenson of Illinois at a Jefferson Jackson Day dinner here May 1, said Monroe Sweetland, Oregon Democratic national committee man.
Stevenson accepted the invitation to speak before his name was filed as a presidential candidate in Oregon.

The Oregon Dairy Products Commission Thursday hired a public opinion firm from Iowa to make the survey. Chairman Paul Reeder, Portland, said he hoped it would be completed by July 1.
The commission plans to use the survey as guidance for a public relations program to be launched later this year. The group has \$80,000 to \$100,000 to spend on the program, the money coming from a charge of 1 cent a pound on all butterfat sold by producers in May and June.
