Tri-Meet Shows At Ashland

The Klamath Falls Pelican track and field team makes its second outing of the season tomorrow afternoon—a tri-meet with Ashland and Crater at the Ashland oval.

With the weather more favorable the last week, Coach Paul Deller's lads have shown improvement in time trials on Medoc Field and should be stronger than they were in losing to Medford last week.

Dean Gordy has jumped into the sprint circle and will join David French and the Mills brothers—Clinton and Don—in the 100-yard dash.

Dick Abraham and Jim Dougherty have been hearing the 20-foot mark in the broad jump. Dougherty spiked his big toe in workout this week and will jump only if the doctor gives his okay.

Jerry Johnson will team with Mike Chase in the high hurdles.

Orville Swindler, searching for some event to settle on, found his stride in the 180-yard low hurdles, galloping the best time in time trials, 33.6. Swindler and Chase are Pelican hopes in this event.

The 880-yard relay event will see French at the anchor spot, along with the Mills brothers and Gordy. Deller has entered 25 boys in the tri-meet.

Barry Pitts, sophomore miler and the only winner at Medford, is on deck as is Steve Chatfield who copped three seconds in relay events against the Tornado.

With just three games of the 1952 Pacific Coast League baseball season written into history, the Los Angeles Angels have taken over exclusive possession of first place.

Thursday night it was Doyle Lade, a big con-rol specialist, tossing a four-hitter for Stan Hack's leaders as they beat Sacramento, 12-2, for their third straight victory.

San Francisco dropped out of the underdog ranks in losing 4-3 to Portland's Beavers. In the other games San Diego's Rookie Willie Latta shut out Oakland 3-0 and Seattle topped Hollywood 4-1. The same teams tangle again Friday night.

Los Angeles gave Lade plenty of support and broke out in a 15-hit attack paced by Catcher Les Peddie, kalloping the best time in time trials, 33.6. Swindler and Chase are Pelican hopes in this event.

Manager Joe Gordon of the Soles was banished in the seventh as he protested a fourth ball call on the Angels' Max West. Sacramento fans tossed a half dozen cushions on the diamond. Catcher Vinnie Smith was also chased and the visitors' scored four runs.

Seattle moved into the second place with San Francisco and San Diego (both with 21 records) with its second victory over Hollywood. The battle of portside hurlers found Steve Nasy outlasting Roy Weikamer. Al Lyons clubbed in three of the Rainiers' four runs with two singles and a long fly.

Portland won a battle of pinch hitters in taking San Francisco. Jack Maguire's eighth inning pinch single batted in the winning run. San Francisco had tied the count in the seventh when Herman Lewis, batting for Len Ratto, singled in the two deadlocking counters. The Seals won the night before from Portland on a pinch hit double.

Carlstrom Heads Sox

LAKEVIEW (Special) — Clyde Carlstrom is the new manager of the Lakeview Blue Sox, Central Oregon League champions, following the resignation of Hugh Mercer who quit because of "pressing business obligations".

Mercer managed the team two years and last year guided the Lakeview club to a title.

Carlstrom said he did not expect Bobby Long, ace southpaw pitcher, to return to the club. Long is with Twin Falls of the Pioneer League in spring training here at Healdsburg, Calif.

Bly's Bennie Moore will be back to fill the shortstop spot. Carlstrom had praise for Bob Mahoney, Paisley coach, a left-hand first baseman and outfielder; and prepsters Ralph Graves and Ted Story. The latter is a left-handed pitcher.

Carlstrom has played with two Pacific Coast League teams, with Oakland in 1930 and San Francisco for a short spell in 1934.

Since he has been affiliated with several semi-pro teams in Klamath Falls, he was a pitcher and utility infielder for the Blue Sox — a named just recently — last year.

Konno In Grand Slam

NEW HAVEN, Conn. (AP) — Ford Konno, brilliant Ohio State freshman from Hawaii, completed a grand-slam in the metric equivalent for the mile here Thursday night when he tied the National and AAU indoor title to his previously won Big Ten and NCAA swimming crowns.

Clocked in 18:47.7, Konno led almost throughout the gruelling marathon as he lapped Jim McLane, the Olympic champ, by two lengths, with John Marshall, the defending titleholder, four lengths back.

Swimming coaches from all over, who saw the race, said it probably was the greatest 1,500-meter ever swum. There wasn't any open water among the three leaders until the last lap when Konno spurred.
