out Benson, 6-5; and Jefferson defeated Washington 8-4.

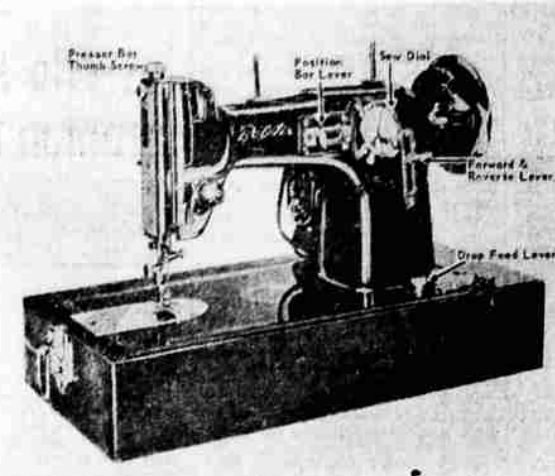
