South Storms Take 7 Lives

NEW ORLEANS (AP) — The Deep South, hit twice in two weeks by terrifying tornadoes and wind storms, counted its newest losses Saturday — seven dead, 63 injured and more than 1 million dollars damage.

The destruction came from wind and rain storms carrying four tornadoes that tore at Louisiana, Alabama and Northwest Florida Friday.

Louisiana, Alabama, Arkansas, Missouri, Mississippi, Tennessee and Kentucky were raked by tornadoes that killed 233 persons March 21, injured 1,100 or more and did a multi-million dollar damage.

One tornado Friday killed four members of a farm family at Arridville, La., 10 miles northeast of Lafayette, deep in the French-speaking Cajun country. Twenty-four persons were injured in the New Orleans area as recorded winds reached 90 miles an hour — hurricane strength. The New Orleans Weather Bureau said winds may have reached 150 to 200 miles per hour after measuring instruments failed.

A radio tower constructed to withstand 135 miles an hour winds was bent to the ground like a wheat straw. Damage estimates ran between \$175,000 and \$300,000 for the general area.

Teenage Girl Shot to Death

COTTAGE GROVE (AP) — A 17-year-old girl was found dead with a bullet in her back early Saturday near her farm home four miles south of here.

The girl, Mary Campbell, a deaf mute, disappeared Friday evening when she left the house to milk the cows. When she failed to return a search started.

Dr. Homer Harris, director of the State Police Crime Laboratory at Portland, was called to aid state and county police in the investigation. The girl died between 6 and 8 p.m. Friday, authorities said. She lived on the farm with her parents.

Less Chance Tomorrow?

LOS ANGELES (AP) — The youth of tomorrow is less likely to carve out a rags-to-riches career, says a San Diego, Calif., psychologist, Dr. Andrew D. Roberts.

His father's job will determine how far up the occupational ladder a boy can go, he said.

The odds are 12.5-to-1 that the son of a laborer or semi-skilled worker will not have a business of his own, Dr. Roberts told the Council of Guidance and Personnel Associations convention Thursday.

"The possibility of substantial advancement vocationally decreases as we become more stable and new outlets are closed to many people," he declared.
