Catcher Young Returns

There was a touch of optimism in the Pelican baseball camp this week as the Klamath Falls nine prepares for the trip to Medford and its conference tilt with the favored Black Tornado Friday.

Reason for the flicker of hope was the return of Letterman Kenny Young to his catching duties. Young had decided to pass up baseball this season but changed his mind.

With Young back, Ron Owings goes back to his familiar third base spot — although there's a chance Coach John McGinnis will switch Owings to shortstop to plug an obvious weakness and move Lundsten in from the outfield to work at third base.

June Diploma Way To Stop Kansas Giant

NEW YORK (NEA)— Bruce Drake has finally discovered a way to stop large Clyde Lovellette.

"With a June diploma," says the Oklahoma coach.

Lanky Lovellette—he's split right up to his chest—is the six-foot-nine Kansas basketball center, you know, who established five new National Collegiate Athletic Association tournament records at Seattle, set a major college three-season mark of 1888 points, and averaged 31 points in the Olympic Tryouts Tournament at Madison Square Garden.

The Kansas All-America from Terre Haute, Ind., will head the U. S. Olympic basketball team, which leaves for Helsinki July 8.

The squad consists of teammates Chuck Hoag, Bill Housland, Dean Kelley, John Keller, Bob Kenney and Bill Linehard; National Amateur Athletic Union Champion Peoria's Ron Bontemps, Marcus Frelinger, Frank McCabe, Dan Philip and Hoyt Williams; and Phillips Oilers' Wayne Glasgow and Bob Kurland.

Peoria's Warren Womble will coach the club. Kansas' Dr. Phog Allen will go along as assistant.

But this started out as a testimonial to Mr. Lovellette, all 21 years and 24 pounds of him.

He has developed into a publicity man's dream. Jayhawk press agents have piled 27 nicknames on the super senior with the face of an Irish cop and the Helen Keller touch—tags like The Terre Haute Terror, Colossal Clyde, Cloudburst and Howie Williams, Monster, and Great White Whale of the Kaw.

Lovellette will go along with the production. Something of a comic, he's the Berle of basketball, keeps the Jayhawks in stitches.

A year ago, when Kansas invaded the east, school officials got the sky-scraping pivot two upper train berths with the head boards knocked out. Lovellette simply wouldn't fit in the standard size bed.

So before turning in, Clyde colored the porter. "Be sure," he said, "to wake up both berths at the same time."

Lovellette was virtually unstoppable the last two weeks of the season leading Kansas to the NCAA crown. Against National Invitation Tournament champion LaSalle, he scored 40 points, hit seven of his first eight attempts.

He added another 22 against Peoria in the Olympic tryouts.

AS GOOD AS MIKAN— "He's great," waxed the New York Knickerbocker's Joe Lapchick. "He's as good as George Mikan was at a comparable stage. In the pivot he's as good as Mikan right now."

"A terrific prospect," added Red Auerbach, Boston Celtics' coach. "He fools you. He's smart, has quick hands, one of the greatest big men I've ever seen."

What about professional basketball? "Not interested," Lovellette says. "The playing career of a pro is short, then where are you? I'd like to play for Phillips Oilers."

Lovellette is worried about his height. "I'm only six-nine," he announces. "When I was in high school they used to say I was six-foot-10 and six-11. I think I must be shrinking."

Opponents wish his basketball scores would follow suit.
