SANTA MARIA, Calif. (AP)—Pvt. Royal F. Crandall was doing yardbird detail at Camp Cooke Friday with a board appointed to review the circumstances of his going AWOL because he couldn't marry a Korean girl.

Crandall surrendered at Ft. MacArthur Tuesday, admitting he had been AWOL since last January because his commanding officer in Korea refused him permission to marry Miss Lee Kum Suk, 19.

Crandall, 28, of Medford, Ore., was placed in the post's labor pool while the judge advocate general sent for Crandall's service papers. The review board probably will get to the case next week.

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West Building Keeps Pace

PORTLAND, Ore. (AP)—Western building last month held its own compared with March a year ago, the magazine Western Building reported Friday.

Reports from 276 cities and counties showed 8 per cent more building jobs started in the West last month than in March, 1951. But the estimated dollar value of the jobs was down about 1 1/2 per cent.

The number and value of dwelling units for the month were down slightly from March a year ago. Permits were issued for 13,900 dwellings, with an estimated value of \$118,702,244. That was a drop of about 4 per cent.

The mortgages involved are in 17 Southern and Western states. They are insured by the Federal Housing Administration or guaranteed by the Veterans Administration.

A defense housing bill enacted last fall gave FNMA authority to make advance commitments to buy such mortgages, but fixed a limit of 200 million dollars on such commitments.

Without the agreement, American wheat would be priced higher in world markets and consequently would probably find fewer buyers. Officials have said that any sizable loss in the export market would probably lead to re-imposition of pre-war government controls.
