Market Gets New Location

Closing of a real estate deal here recently by the Gray Real Estate firm of Al Longmire and Burton Gray has resulted in a new location for Oregon Food Store No. 4, now located at 1749 Oregon Ave.

Six lots of the 1200 block on Oregon Ave., at the southeast corner of Upham and Oregon Ave. were purchased for an undisclosed amount by Joe Fales, owner of Oregon Food Store.

The property formerly contained a gas station, and part of it is occupied by what used to be a Safeway store.

Complete remodeling of the former store is planned. Included in the plans will be produce refrigeration racks; self-service meat counters, a large drug and houseware department and other innovations. Parking will be provided on both sides of the building.

Contractor for the remodeling, according to store officials is Frank Douglas.

Opening of the new location is expected to be sometime in early May.

Gold Medals For Fire Aid

NEW YORK, (AP) — The National Board of Fire Underwriters cited a Hawaiian daily newspaper, a country weekly published in Pennsylvania and two radio stations Tuesday for outstanding work in fire prevention.

Named as recipients of the Underwriters' 1952 Gold Medal awards were the Honolulu Star-Bulletin, top winner in the daily newspaper class; the Eklund Journal of Elkland, Pa. leader among the weeklies; and radio stations WOWO of Fort Wayne, Ind., and WSJS of Winston-Salem, N. C., which tied for first place in their classification.

The Gold Medals are awarded annually by the National Board of newspapers and radio stations which are deemed to have rendered an extraordinary public service in the cause of fire safety.

In addition to the Gold Medal winners, the board singled out the following publications and radio stations for honorable mention: Dailies: Ellensburg Daily Record, Ellensburg, Wash.; Register Guard, Eugene, Ore.

An Oregon City man is responsible for seeing that Klamath Falls is back in Oregon and not in California — as far as Chicot County, Ark., folks are concerned, anyway.

E. E. McLendon, Oregon City, was reading the news columns of the Chicot Spectator, the Lake Village, Ark., weekly newspaper, when he came on an item about Klamath Falls, Calif.

McLendon wrote a letter to Arkansas reporting their error, and then wrote one to Klamath Falls (Oregon) and asked the Chamber of Commerce to send Lake Village five pounds of Klamath Netted Gem potatoes which he had boasted about.

Klamath spudman Troy V. Cook did the honors, packing them in a container plainly marked "Klamath Pine Boxes."

Klamath Chamber Mgr Frank Tucker received a copy of the Chicot Spectator yesterday. On the front page: a picture of Klamath Netted Gems under the title "Spuds What Am Spuds—From Oregon."

In a story describing what had happened, Publisher L. W. Mansur's paper reported:

"The 'spuds' arrived last week, and they turned out even finer than Mr. McLendon boasted. And — they're very good baked."

New Bomber Kept Secret

MOSES LAKE, Wash. (AP) — Further extensive tests, all of them cloaked in strict military secrecy, are ahead for America's newest strategic air weapon which has passed its first flight test.

The weapon is the swept-wing, eight-jet Boeing YB-52 Stratofortress. It made its maiden flight Tuesday from Seattle to Larson Air Force Base, here.

The plane was airborne nearly three hours, flying about the Puget Sound county for an undisclosed distance before setting down at its new test home.

It was the second YB-52 built, the other being returned to the factory for modification without yet being flown.

Atomic Flash For Las Vegas

LAS VEGAS, Nev. (AP) — The second blast of the spring atomic series flashed brilliantly at 9:30 a. m. Tuesday at Nevada proving grounds.

It was plainly visible in Las Vegas, some 75 miles distant, but there were no reports of damage.

The explosion was the 14th at the Atomic Energy Commission test site here and unofficially the United States' 20th.

Observers reported it appeared larger than the blast April 1 which opened the current series.

The nuclear device was dropped from an Air Force plane over Yucca Flat, the AEC announced. Yucca Flat is the northernmost of the two dry lakes the AEC uses for test shots. The April 1 experiment was conducted on Frenchman Flat.

The feature blast of the series comes next week. More than 7,000 Army, Marine and Air Force men are to participate in atomic maneuvers.
