Wilson Rapped in Steel Talk

WASHINGTON, (AP)— Chairman Nathan P. Feinsinger of the Wage Stabilization Board (WSB) accused former Economic Mobilizer Charles C. Wilson Tuesday of creating "havoc" in the crucial steel dispute.

Feinsinger told senators that Wilson stirred up grave trouble by calling the WSB's settlement recommendations a serious threat to the anti-inflation and stabilization program.

When Wilson modified his statement to the extent of saying the WSB findings should be the basis of negotiations toward peace in the industry, Feinsinger said, the "retraction was too little and too late to avoid the havoc caused by the first statement."

Feinsinger was called before the Senate Labor Committee in the latest development of a situation which has seen: The CIO steelworkers threaten to strike if the industry recommendation, Wilson's resignation as economic mobilizer, and government seizure of the mills to keep production going.

Wilson resigned with a statement that President Truman had changed his mind about granting the steel industry a price increase to compensate for the board's wage recommendations.

"This atmosphere was scarcely conducive to the beginning of negotiations looking towards settlement," Feinsinger told the committee.

The wage board chief said "quite properly I was not consulted on the question of seizure" but defended that action by the President a week ago as "sound and right."

The President has been widely criticized for what his antagonists have called a "usurpation" of power in taking over the steel properties.

Court Holds Wanger Fate

SANTA MONICA, Calif. (AP)— Walter Wanger submitted his fate to the court Tuesday, and despite a possibly sensational trial out of concern for the children involved in his shooting of his wife's agent.

"Also because of the love that he had for his wife," Wanger's attorney, Jerry Giesler, told reporters.

Giesler submitted the transcript of testimony before the county grand jury which indicted Wanger for shooting Jennings Lang, 39.

The judge will decide the case without further testimony.

The silver-haired producer wounded Lang, agent for Wanger's movie star wife, Joan Bennett, in the groin last Dec. 13.

Superior Judge Harry J. Borde announced he would return his verdict next Tuesday.

Wanger was indicted on a charge of assault with intent to commit murder.

Miss Bennett arrived in court just as the proceedings ended.

Smartly attired in a blue-grey gaudy dress and white hat, she answered no questions.

Miss Bennett, Lang and others had been subpoenaed but the procedure decided on eliminated the need for testimony.

Wanger and his wife did not meet.
