

New Type Irrigation District Sets Water Claim

Articles of incorporation were filed in Salem Tuesday for the New Pine Creek Irrigation District, an irrigation district which is somewhat different from the other irrigation districts which are in operation in Klamath County.

The landowners involved in the incorporation are Jack R. Chapman, Frank J. Sullivan, William Tubach, Dan Liskey, William Paul Brethaupt, Frank Howard, H. B. Holzhauser, Fred R. Robinson, Mervin W. Rice, Springfield Ore.; Marie Green, Los Angeles; and Ida Fink, Sonoma, Calif.

The district is designed to benefit by irrigation some 2,980 acres of land. Its boundaries include approximately 3,000 acres. About 752 acres of the land to be benefited already has a Warren Act contract with the Bureau of Reclamation for pumping water, and 431 acres has a prior state water right.

Water for the acreage is to be obtained from Lost River by pumping, under a contract now being negotiated with the Bureau of Reclamation. A major portion of the benefited acreage has been under pumping irrigation for some years, so the formation of a district is rather a matter of confirmation and determination of rights, committing the water to the land.

A corporation was set up under a 1937 state law because of a ruling of the Bureau of Reclamation against water rights contracts with individuals.

Each property owner will have to defray the cost of pumping and distribution of the water on his land, but the district will collect capital charges and pay them to the Bureau of Reclamation, the payments based on a 20-year period were drawn up by the Farrants and

Maxwell law firm. Directors of the corporation are Brethaupt, Chapman and Liskey,

with Frank Howard as secretary. It is understood that Brethaupt is to be president.

CIO Union Sued By Firm

TACOMA, W. — Schaefer Bros. Logging Company of Aberdeen has filed a \$4,000 a day damage suit in Federal Court here against a striking CIO Woodworkers' union.

The suit is against Aberdeen local 32 of the International woodworkers of America. The Schaefer firm is one of the major logging and lumber operators of Grays Harbor County.

The union local's president, Al Drawsky, and other officers also are named as defendants.

The suit alleges that the union officers called employees off the job at Olympic Camp March 27 in violation of a contract entered last November. It alleges the strike is illegal and asks for \$4,000 a day damages for the duration of the strike.

State Battles Dam at Pelton

SALEM, Ore. — Oregon Tuesday went to court to try to stop Portland General Electric Company from building Pelton Dam on the Deschutes River.

Arthur G. Higgs, assistant attorney general for the state, said he had filed with the U. S. court of appeals a petition to set aside the Federal Power Commission's order giving a license to PGE for construction of the dam.

The Oregon Fish and Game Commission objected to the dam when the power commission held a hearing last June. But the FPC

held the objections not sufficiently valid to block a permit.

In Tuesday's petition, Higgs said, the state presents its opinion that the FPC lacks authority to give a permit to a private utility for a dam on a non-navigable river within the state. The state controls that stream under the Desert Lands Act of Congress, the petition says.
