

Food Shortage Outlook May Up Bureau Budget

WASHINGTON, (AP) — A House appropriations committee's prediction of a national food shortage by 1975 may spur a drive in congress to increase the 1953 Agriculture Department Budget.

Leaders of the House farm-state delegation said Tuesday they may use the committee forecast as a lever to try to pry more money out of the House when the budget bill is considered.

The Agriculture Department appropriation bill comes before the House when it returns next week from an Easter holiday. It provides for \$724,003,699 for the year starting July 1, a cut of \$24,412,129, or about 3 per cent, from President Truman's budget request.

The committee said research and soil conservation activities must be strengthened. It made relatively small cuts in the 1953 budgets for this work.

However, many members from farm states believe additional funds should be provided and the time to provide them is now.

Their drive for a larger budget is expected to encounter stiff opposition from some city members who still are irked over farm-state opposition to public housing programs that primarily affect big cities.

Klamath's Young Republicans Ponder Five GOP Presidential Possibilities

Five Klamath Young Republicans stated the cases of the nation's five "most talked of" presidential candidates at a GOP get-together in the Winema last night.

Earlier, during a dinner, most of Klamath County's Republican candidates for local and state offices were introduced, including Jess Gard, a candidate for National committeeman, and Sig Unander, running for Republican nomination for the office of state treasurer.

Young Republican Chairman Chuck Johnson presided. Forrest Kelly opened the presidential talks speaking for Harold Stassen. He called the Minnesotaan new president of the University of Pennsylvania, neither an interventionist nor an isolationist—but a man who takes the middle of the road. Stassen is a young man, only 44, is a capable administrator (elected governor of Minnesota when only 31) and has a program closely tied to the farm. He comes from farm stock.

Mrs. Eva Cook answered a lot of questions about Robert Taft, Ohio's senator and presidential hopeful. The idea he can't win, she said, is merely propaganda put out by the administration and opponents to Taft.

"On the contrary," she said, "he has never lost. He won his senatorship in Ohio in 1940 by carrying his fight straight to Labor. Labor leaders had condemned him because of his Taft-Hartley law."

Taft would effect the Hoover report, she said, and proposes a cut-back in government spending to at the most 25 percent of the national income, or about 50 billion dollars a year (not \$5 billion as is slated for 1952).

California's Gov. Earl Warren came in for strong support by young GOP Bruce Virth who pointed him out as a "Progressive Republican" elected to the governorship three times in a state where Democrats outnumber Republicans three to two. Warren feels states

should get counsel and advice from government—not heavy aid all the time.

With pointed to Warren's ability as an administrator, noting he governs the second most populated state in the nation in a way which has drawn commendation from both parties. He has often won nominations in both parties under the California cross-filing system.

Gen. Douglas MacArthur has no personal aspirations as president, Bill Wales said. The general has won glory throughout the world already. Too old? Wales pointed to Churchill, recently elected Prime Minister of England at the age of 77. MacArthur is 72. Wales said that a military man in the White House at present wouldn't be as bad as it may seem, since the president is commander and chief of all armed forces in time of war.

MacArthur, he said, is one of the world's greatest strategists. Wales also noted the general's administrative abilities in handling

Japan after the Island Kingdom's downfall. "Japan has been built into a strong nation and a staunch friend of America while Europe is still in shambles," he said. "I Like Ike" was Chet Homaker's theme as he backgrounded some 40 persons in attendance at the meeting on General Dwight D. Eisenhower. Lower, Homaker noted that Hoover, in the late 1920's, offered Americans leadership but no support. The New Deal swept in and since has been leading us into socialism.
