Elliott Stars In NY Debut

Bob Elliott's crashing two-homer debut chased the Monte Irvin blues out of the Polo Grounds. New York Giant fans, dubious of the value of a 25-year-old Boston Brave "castoff" came to the Polo Grounds Wednesday night to be shown Elliott sure showed them. He made Irvin's make fracture seem less tragic.

First a home run deep into the upper left field seats in the fourth inning. Then No. 2 into the right field seats in the eighth.

Elliott's home runs plus steady four-hit pitching by Sal Maglie made New York's first night opener a success with a 5-3 win over the Phillies. It was Sal the Barber's ninth straight over the White Sox. He struck out eight and restricted his trouble to the three-run fifth.

Ironically, the Braves staggered through a turgid afternoon, absorbing a 14-8 beating from the slugging Brooklyn Dodgers. The Braves flattened Max Burkout in the first inning and kept it up all day for 20 hits, including five by Duke Snider and a homer, double and single by Roy Campanella.

Their main reason for losing, Stan Musial, pitched with the best to arrive home three runs with a homer and double in the Cardinals' second straight night victory over the Pittsburgh, 6-5. The Cards ripped

Vic Raschi got the world champion New York Yankees off winning in their drive toward a fourth straight pennant with an 8-1 romp over the Philadelphia A's.

Cleveland and the surprising St. Louis Browns kept step in their two-way tie for the American League lead. The Indians ripped Chicago, 1-0, on Rookie Jim Fridge's homer and Bob Lemon's three-hit pitching while Rogers Hornsby's Browns clipped Detroit, 4-1.

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Athletic Storms Brewing

HOT SPRINGS, Va. (AP) — The National Association of Collegiate Commissioners opened a four-day annual meeting here Thursday in an atmosphere of peace and harmony — but members were mindful of a storm cloud on the horizon that was apt to break open at any time.

Chief among the knotty problems expected to come before the meeting is the set of controversial recommendations of the special committee on athletic policy of the American Council on Education.

Asa Bushnell, president of the commissioners group and Eastern College Athletic Conference commissioner, indicated the ACE recommendations may become the principal topic of conversation before the heads of the major athletic conferences leave for home Sunday.

Besides the ACE recommendations, topics on the agenda include rules changes in football and basketball, formation of pre-season officials' clinics and preparation of national exams for football and basketball officials.
