OTI Continues to Grow While Few Foes Attack

SALEM — The State Federation of Labor, with the help of some economy-minded legislators and others who don't want tax money spent for vocational education, still wants to wreck Oregon Tech.

OTI gets students from all over the nation. Last year the students came from all Oregon counties except Jefferson and Sherman.

Some legislators are disgusted with the amount of money it takes to run the 922-acre campus.

The 1947 Legislature appropriated \$520,000 to run OTI for two years, with the vocational education department promising the school quickly would become self-supporting.

Supporters of the school, including the controlling State Board of Education, says the school's graduates have had outstanding success in their post-graduate jobs.
