Four Unfortunate Children Get New 'Home' from Lodge

Four youngsters who until two years ago were residents of Klamath Falls now call Mooseheart, near Chicago, "home."
 Their father, Joseph William Davis, died here Feb. 10, 1950. He was a member of the Klamath Falls Lodge No. 1106 Loyal Order of Moose.
 At that time there were five children in the family, but their whereabouts was not known until Nevada welfare authorities found them living in a barn near Winnemucca. One of the children was dead of exposure.
 Judge Merwyn H. Brown, Winnemucca, learned that Davis had been a member of the Moose lodge here, and notified local Secy. Clyde Hooper of the situation. Action to

admit the four remaining children to the Child City of Mooseheart was begun immediately.
 The four—Clara, Virginia, 10; Dorey Marie, 8; Jess William, 7 and Lois Marie, 5—left Winnemucca late in February in company with a matron and free tickets furnished by the Western Pacific Railroad.
 There at Mooseheart they are to be raised and educated through the high school level and taught a trade along with 1000 other youngsters, many there by circumstances similar to theirs.
 Mooseheart is maintained solely by the Moose Lodge, and each child's care and education, housing, and clothing adds up to about \$15,000.
 The four young Davises, after two years of untold misery, are off to a brand new way of life.

Spud Shipments Below Normal

Only 94 carloads of potatoes have been shipped so far in April, a mere trickle of normal shipments early in shipping season.
 So far this season 9155 cars have gone to market, while a year ago 12,308 had been shipped to date.
 Eight cars were marked out yesterday, but the State Potato Inspection Service reports some days are now seeing but two or three cars going out.
