Stocks NEW YORK — Mild buying interest in rails late in Saturday's session but the stock market slightly ahead. It was one of the slowest Saturday's in months with the market spreading most of its time quietly tickling back and forth narrowly. Prices when they changed at all usually moved fractionally. Only a mere handful of higher priced issues strayed a point or more. One of these was Texas Pacific Land Trust, which was up 4 points at 180 early in the day and then fell back. It hit the most active list up 11 points. 400,000 shares of the slowest 1951 bond series this year was 390,000 shares traded Feb. 16.
