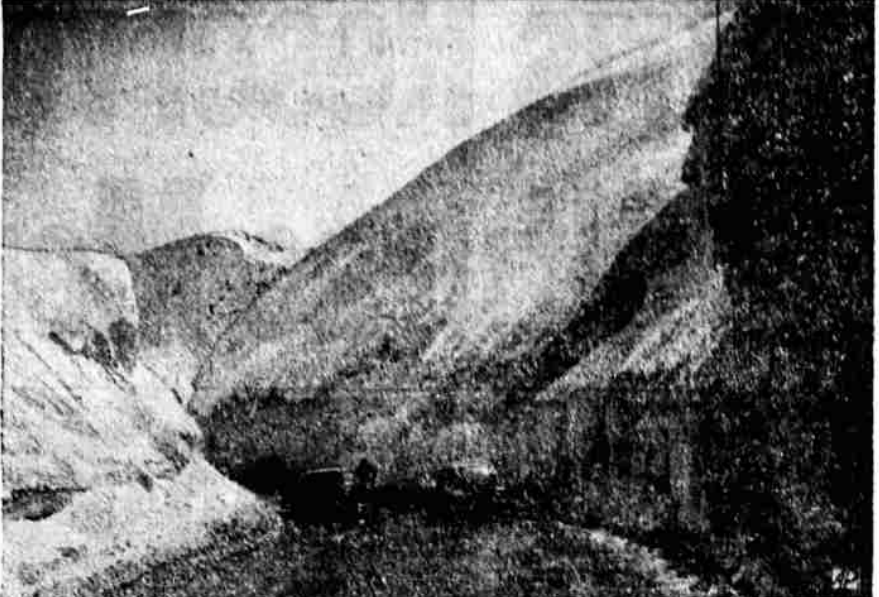

Legion Meet Interest High

Tremendous interest is being displayed throughout the state in plans for the American Legion convention to be held here this summer, report Legionnaires who are doing the spade work for the gathering.

The convention is scheduled to start July 25 when first sessions are held by the 8 and 40, and the following day will see a big parade and banquet put on by the 40 and 8.

July 27, Sunday, will be given over to a memorial and opening service, and drum corps competition.

Bly and Lakeview Legionnaires are to be hosts at a barbecue.

Monday, July 28, will be business sessions all day and a joint Legion and Auxiliary banquet at night.

The following day will also be devoted to business sessions and a parade at 2 p.m. The convention is to end Wednesday, July 30.

Only once previously was an American Legion state convention held in Klamath Falls, back in 1923. It is expected to be the largest gathering scheduled for Klamath Falls—which is fast becoming the convention city of Oregon—this year.
