A resolution declaring the intention of the Common Council to pave and improve Lowell Street from Eldorado Avenue to Pacific Terrace; and directing and directing certain steps to be taken in connection therewith, said project to be known as IMPROVEMENT UNIT NO. 117.

WHEREAS, the City Engineer, pursuant to a resolution of the Common Council heretofore adopted, having filed plans, specifications and estimates for the cost of improving Lowell Street from Eldorado Avenue to Pacific Terrace, and the Council finding said plans, specifications and estimates satisfactory for said project, which shall be known as IMPROVEMENT UNIT NO. 117;

Therefore, be it resolved by the Common Council of the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon, as follows:

Section I.
That said plans, specifications and estimates for the improvement of said portions of said street, heretofore filed by the City Engineer, be and the same are hereby approved, and said project shall be known as IMPROVEMENT UNIT NO. 117.

That the Common Council of the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon hereby declares its intention to improve said portions of said street in accordance with the plans, specifications and estimates as follows:

TYPE "A" and "B" — to consist of paving street with 3 inch asphalt pavement together with cement curb and gutter. The existing pavement is to be laid from the new gutter to the existing pavement. The existing pavement to be overlaid with 2 inch asphalt pavement, type "B". The overall width of the pavement and curbs will be 32 feet.

Cement walks 4 inches in depth by 3 feet in width will be constructed where none exist at the present time.

TYPE "C" CEMENT AND TYPE "D" ASPHALT — To consist of paving street 6 inches cement concrete pavement with cement curb and gutter. The aforementioned pavement is to be laid from the new gutter to the existing pavement. The existing pavement to be overlaid with 2 inch asphalt pavement, type "B". The overall width of the pavement and curbs will be 32 feet.

Cement walks 4 inches in depth by 3 feet in width will be constructed where none exist at the present time.

TYPE "E" ASPHALT AND TYPE "F" ASPHALT — To consist of paving street 6 inches cement concrete pavement with cement curb and gutter. Said estimates include engineering, supervision, advertising, clerical assistance, attorney's fees and unforeseen contingencies.

Section II.
That the property lying within the boundaries heretofore described, and the same is hereby declared to be benefited by the said improvement, to-wit:

Beginning at the most southerly corner of lot 14, Block 8, Hillside Addition, City of Klamath Falls, Oregon, thence northerly along the easterly line of Eldorado Ave. to the most westerly corner of Lot 1, Block 8 of said Addition, thence northerly along the northerly line of said Lot 1 to its intersection with the east line of said Lot 8, thence northerly to the most northerly corner of Lot 6, Block 8 of said Addition, thence easterly along the south line of Van Ness Ave. to the southerly line of said Addition, thence southeasterly along the south-westerly line of Pacific Terrace to the southeasterly corner of Lot 2, Block 8 of said Addition, thence southeasterly along the south-easterly lines of Lots 2, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11 and 14 in Block 8 to the point of beginning.

That all the property included in the aforesaid boundaries above described, be and the same is hereby declared to be benefited by said improvement and assessed for the expenses thereof.

Section III.
That Monday the 12th day of May, 1952, at the hour of 7:30 p.m. according to the time prevailing on that date, at the Council Chamber of the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon, be fixed as the time and place for hearing of objections and remonstrances against said proposed improvement.

Section IV.
That the Police Judge be and he is hereby authorized and directed to cause notice of such hearing to be published as provided by the City Charter of said City and shall publish this resolution as provided by law, and within five days after the first publication thereof the City Engineer shall cause to be conspicuously posted at each end of the line of contemplated improvement such notice as is provided for by law and ordinance.
