Field Trials Open Tomorrow



BLACK PANTHER, American and Canadian field trial champion Labrador, is among the outstanding retrievers entered in the Shasta Cascade Retriever Trials at the airport over the weekend. Panther has collected more points than any other retriever in the nation. He'll be worked by veteran handler Snuffy Beliveau, shown here.

Retrievers rule Klamath Falls for three full days in the Shasta Cascade licensed spring trials that open tomorrow, 8 a. m., on the Airport grounds.

The three-day dog meet comprises four events—terry, amateur, qualified and open—all-age.

Some 120 retrievers will follow the whistle in the four divisions. This isn't a record field here but there are probably more champions on hand than ever before.

The derby and amateur stakes will run together and should finish up tomorrow.

The qualifying stake starts tomorrow afternoon and winds up Saturday.

MAIN EVENT

Then comes the main event where the top retrievers vie for points toward annual National Trial competition—the open all-age.

Conspicuous by his absence will be Brigall's Gringo, the National and International field trial champion Labrador. Gringo, which has been on hand for several seasons here in bi-annual meets, has been retired.

But Gringo's owner and handler, Cliff Brigall of Long Beach, Calif., will have two male Labs in the field, Brigall's Nick and Brigall's Californian.

SPOTLIGHT

Probably occupying the brightest beam of the spotlight will be Ardyn's Ace of Merquill, a black Lab that has won its last eight trials and 10 of its last 11.
