Sox Stop Yanks In 11 Frames

 Those beautiful Browns are not the only "amazing" team in the American League. How about those smart Boston Red Sox?

Lou Boudreau's hook-checked lobs have been knocking the hitters out of the opposition right from the start, but they have been overshadowed by the tremendous surge of the once-lovely St. Louis Browns.

It took a Brownie postmortem to cast the spotlight on the comeback of once-powerful Boston. The south-pastured Red Sox hurled a "move over" challenge at the World Champion New York Yankees, 3-2, to sweep their two-game series.

It took the Red Sox 11 minutes to do it but in the end they had their third consecutive victory stored away to boost their season record to nine triumphs and only two losses. That actually put them a half game in front of the Browns.

St. Louis, however, remained in first place percentage-wise. The Browns showed a 7.185 mark to Boston's 9.2418.

In the day's only other activity, the Boston Braves overcame a 3-0 deficit with three tallies in the eighth and three more in the 10th to defeat the New York Giants, 6-3, at the Polo Grounds.

Rain and cold weather cancelled all other games in the Major Leagues.

COSTLY WALK

Once again, it was the Red Sox middle corps that paved the way for Boston's victory. Two successive bases on balls by Relief Pitcher Bob Kuzava provided the winning run but it was a single by Freshman Barney White that set up the tally.

The outfield catcher, a former Seattle Rainier and University of Washington star, honored for Boston's first run in the hills. In the 10th he singled and advanced to second on Don Dinaggio's one-inning and moved all the way around when Kuzava walked Jimmy Pitarro and Billy Goodman.

VICTORIA, SPOKANE KEEP CLEAN SLATE

Vancouver, led by John Ritchey, last year's WIL batting champ, pounded out 17 hits in routing Wenatchee 12-4. Ritchey hit two triples, a double and a single. Teammates Edo Vanni, Jim Wert and Manager Billy Schuster were almost as effective. Vanni got 3 for 4.

The heavy hitters also had their day at Yakima where Victoria's Tyees remained undefeated and tied with Spokane for the league lead by downing the Bears, 16-8. Four Yakima hurlers yielded 16 hits to the Tyees.

HOMER

Gene Kluger's two-run homer gave Yakima a 6-2 lead in the fourth inning. But Victoria came back with a seven-run attack in the seventh and added two more in the ninth. Tee Manager Cece Gerriotti's two-run homer was the big blow of the seventh.

The sixth inning was the big one at Lewiston as the newcomers to the league manhandled Tri-City 12-6. The Broncos chased in seven runs in the inning.

Webfoots, Riegger Beats Jantzer In Grand American Shootoff

 Pennant-hungry Washington moves into Oregon Friday for a make-or-break Northern Division baseball series with Oregon State and Oregon.

The Huskies, currently tied with the Beavers at Corvallis Friday and Saturday, then move to Eugene for games Monday and Tuesday with the Webfoots.

Bob Houbregs, the Huskies basketball ace, drew the starting mound assignment for the Friday contest at Corvallis.

Oregon tied Washington for the division's lead Thursday by whipping Idaho 13-6 at Eugene. The winners scored 11 of their runs in the wild first inning during which 15 Oregon batters paraded before three Idaho pitchers.
