Golden Anniversary Brings Ed Wynn's First Recalling

HOLLYWOOD — (NEA) — Guys and Dolls: It's 30 years in show business for singing Ed Wynn, who's finally dropping the "Iron Curtain" he's always kept around his youthful memories.

"I've never forgotten," he told me, "but I know I have to this year. Fifty years in show business is an event."

Some of Ed's reminiscing: "He ran away from home at 13 to play a mandolin for a medicine man on a buckboard wagon. On Aug. 8, 1902, he made his stage debut for \$12 a week in Northampton, in a stock company piece entitled the play, 'American Girl.'"

"My mother was Turkish and my father was a Bohemian Jew," he giggled. "So what role did I give me? They cast me as a 70-year-old Methodist minister."

But there was vaudeville before the acts, he said, and "That's where I got my chance to be funny. I remember it well because I'm still telling the same jokes."

Now it's the "Reissue Hardboiled." Lois Collier's got one for her role of Kent Taylor's girl friend in the "Boston Blackie" films. No up-to-date poodle cut for Lois, who says:

"My medium length — not too short and not too long. You know why? So I won't be out of style when they reissue the pictures for the next 10 years. My clothes are the same — suits and medium length skirts, Reissue clothes."

Bette Davis and the late Leslie Howard were Bogart's co-stars in the film and it was because of Howard that Bogart is a movie star today. He told me:

"I almost didn't get the movie role. Warner's wanted Eddie Robinson for the part. Leslie heard about it and told Jack Warner he wouldn't do the picture if I wasn't cast as Duke. I owe my whole movie career to Howard."

Group Fights Cloud Seeding

MEDFORD (AP) — A group organized as the Moisture Conservation League of Jackson County is trying to stop cloud seeding in the Rogue Valley.

The group filed petitions with District Attorney Paul Haviland of Jackson County to outlaw cloud seeding or use of any mechanical means to try to interfere with weather.

The move is aimed at fruit growers and shippers who have hired cloud seeders to try to prevent damaging hail storms in the growing season.

Haviland said he thought the ban on cloud seeding could be applied legally to a local area, but would be unconstitutional if applied to a larger area.

Snoqualmie Top Forest Draw

PORTLAND (AP) — Snoqualmie National Forest is the most popular in the Pacific Northwest.

Of nearly 12 million persons who visited the 19 national forests in the region in the past year 4,580,400 were in the Snoqualmie forest, Frank B. Folsom, head of the Forest Service Recreation and Lands Division, estimated.

Mt. Hood forest in Oregon had an estimated 1,931,000 visitors, and Wenatchee in Washington had 1,862,000.

Mt. Hood attracted the most winter sports enthusiasts: 197,000. Snoqualmie had 125,000. Wenatchee 69,000 and Mt. Baker 27,500.
