

# Police Reporter Learns He Was Theft Suspect

PHOENIX, Ariz. (AP) — A surprised Phoenix police reporter learned Friday he had been under investigation for months as the "Redcap" bandit who had staged a series of robberies here.

Don Dederer of the Arizona Republic was told by police of the intense scrutiny he had been under because of the "dead ringer" resemblance between him and the youthful gunman.

It wasn't until police caught Charles Soule, 17-year-old high school student, late Thursday night that suspicion was lifted.

Police Chief Earl O'Clair said Soule had admitted all of the robberies of which the reporter had been suspected. The robber had gained his nickname by always wearing a red cap during his activities.

One look at the two together and police said they could easily understand the confusion — both have crew haircuts, are 6 feet tall, and appear to be in their late teens or early 20's.

In fact, Dederer, 22, stated in a by-lined story in his paper, he learned he had been positively identified by one robbery victim as the

# U.N. Planes Blast Enemy

SEOUL, Korea (AP) — Allied fighter-bombers kept in low over the Korean battlefield Friday bombing and strafing Communist frontline positions a second consecutive day.

Dense clouds blanketing North Korea gave the Reds a temporary respite from aerial bombardment of hard-hit railways and supply facilities.

But Communist troop and artillery concentrations got the full treatment of bombs, rockets, jetted gasoline and machinegun bullet.

Ground action along the 155-mile battlefront was limited to patrol skirmishes and light Red probing attacks.

The Heavy Cruiser St. Paul destroyed seven Communist bunkers and other Red facilities on the eastern end of the battle line Thursday, while the Cruiser Manchester and Destroyer Buck knocked out a half dozen Red coastal guns.

Carrier-based planes cut rail lines at 115 places in northeastern Korea Thursday.

The Air Force announced a re-evaluation of an earlier report that Allied fighter-bombers had knocked out eight Red tanks on the central front Thursday. It said eight tanks were sighted, but only one was destroyed. The original report was based on a ground estimate, the Air Force said.

# Strange Will Sets Pattern

LOS ANGELES (AP) — A strange will provides that two women may have incomes for life of \$300 a month each and rent-free homes if they meet these conditions:

- 1 Never drink or smoke.
  - 2 Remain unmarried and unmarried.
  - 3 Refrain from any immorality.
- These provisions were contained in the will of Percy T. Martin, real estate developer, which was filed for probate Wednesday.

The two women named in the will are Mrs. Frances Miller, 48, a spinster who lives in a Los Angeles hotel, and Mrs. Helen Dill, 50, a widow of nearby Gardena.

Martin, 76, who died last Tuesday, left an estate with an estimated value of \$15,000. His will, dated June 30, 1950, named two trustees to make "reasonable investigations" into the conduct of Mrs. Miller and Mrs. Dill. The two women could not be reached for comment.

In connection with each woman, the will stated:

"Any and all payments herein provided shall immediately cease, and are never to be paid again, in the event that subsequent to my death she becomes engaged to marry, marries, or at any time lives with any man out of wedlock or in any manner whatsoever engages in or pursues an immoral or otherwise socially not acceptable life or makes any use of tobacco or alcoholic beverages or liquors."

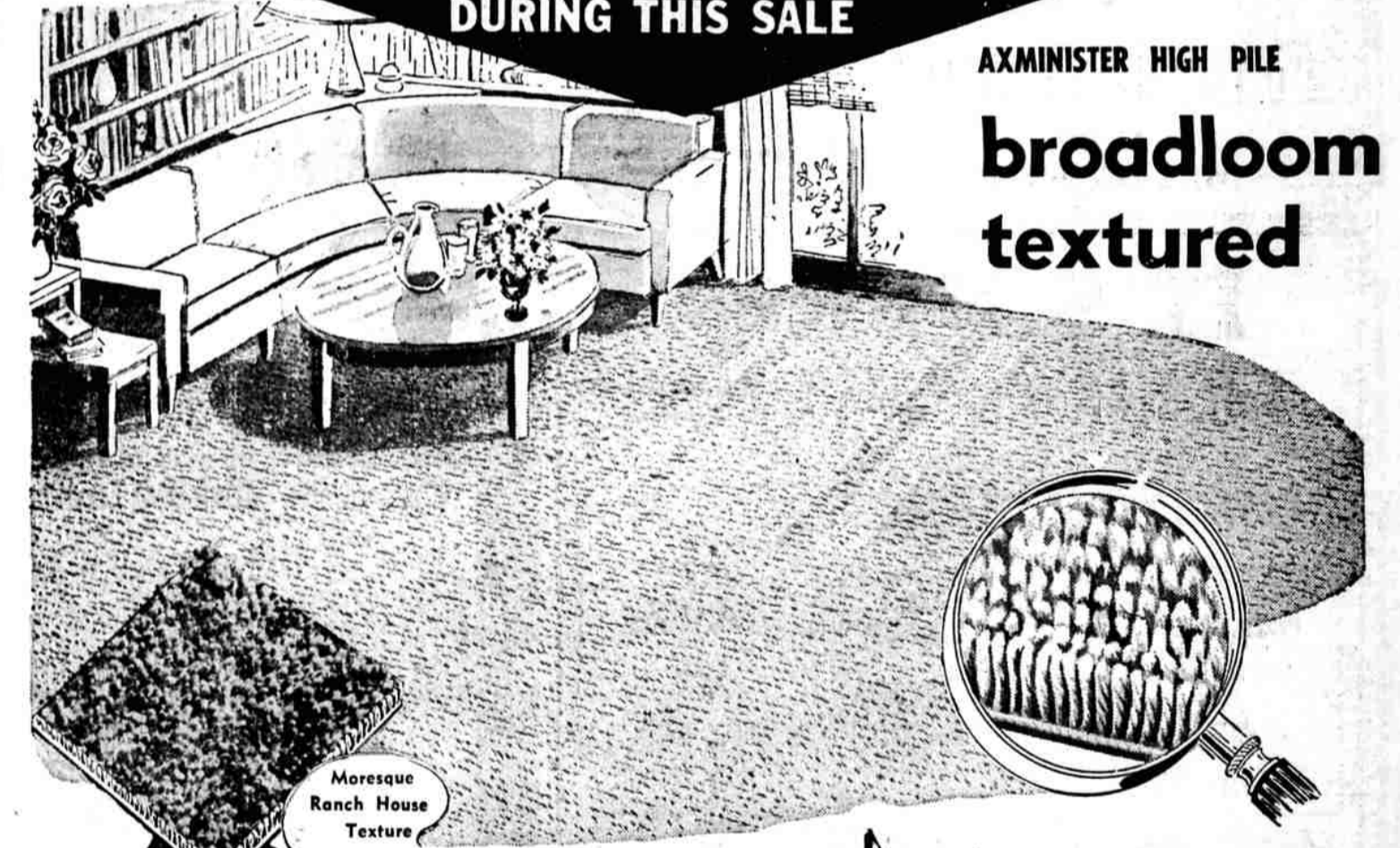
