The book offers this information: "One of the principal accomplishments of the auxiliary is the awarding of \$50.00 in suitable prizes in each of the seven states within the association to deserving 4-H girls showing Angus projects."  
Founded October 22, 1944, in Pendleton, by breeders' wives (who had been meeting without organization for some time) to help the parent association, plan social activities, and in general, to be hostesses at any association meetings.  
Mrs. Edward E. Parsons, Payette, Idaho, is scholarship chairman. Her committee will award the \$1000 in scholarships to girls showing Angus. So . . . what on the surface might appear to be solely a social gathering . . . is that . . . and more . . . an auxiliary with an aim.
