Eugene Police Top Shooters

Sharpshooters from Eugene Police Department took first and second spots Sunday in an inter-city pistol match with Klamath Falls policemen at the Airport shooting range. Nelson and Mollett placed first and second with scores of 262 and 243. In third spot was Klamath Falls patrolman Jim Brown with a score of 230. Only other Klamath Falls patrolman in the top seven scores was R. N. Adkins, scoring 198. The Eugene contingent was treated to dinner after the match by Klamath Falls officers.

Crater Draws Historian

An eminent British historian was scheduled to visit Crater Lake National Park today, according to Chief Ranger Lou Hallock. He is Arnold Toynebe, who with his wife is planning to visit the park from Eugene in company with Lyle M. Nelson, director of Public Services of the University of Oregon. Over the weekend, Hallock reported, 318 automobiles carried 1217 visitors through the Park's gateways. He noted that the south and west entrance highways were the only ones open to Crater Lake. There has been some misinformation out that tourists can continue through the park and out the north entrance toward Bend without backtracking. However, Hallock said that highway won't open until about July 4.

KOREAN ELECTION

Massachusetts Election Draws Major Interest

Four states name delegates to the national presidential conventions this week but major interest centered on Massachusetts whose could whittle Sen. Robert Taft's 266 to 233 delegate lead over Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower. Fifty-nine Republican delegates were chosen in district and state conventions Saturday. An Associated Press tabulation indicated 33 of them were for Taft and 21 for Eisenhower, although there were disputes over the leanings of some of the delegates.

Schools to Have Art Exhibit

Gift to Speak On Conservation

The Langell Valley Pilot Soil Conservation District will be the subject of a talk by Lloyd Gift before a meeting of the Klamath Modoc Chapter of the Izaak Walton League to be held Wednesday evening April 30 at the Klamath Forest Protective Association headquarters at the Weed Ashland highway junction. Col. Tom L. King, executive secretary of the Oregon State Division of the Izaak Walton League will also speak on the action being taken by the League to encourage the formation of soil conservation districts in other parts of the state.

Political eyes were turned mostly on Massachusetts, home state of Gen. Eisenhower's campaign manager, Sen. Lodge, Massachusetts will send 38 delegates to the National Republican Convention—and Lodge claims most of them for Eisenhower. The state has 10 at-large delegate candidates, who are unopposed and who are reportedly divided this way: Two pledged to Taft, two to Eisenhower, and six undecided. Possibly 400,000 voters will ballot on 72 Democratic delegates—with half votes each—and the remaining 28 GOP delegates. A sweep of the GOP's 28 delegates—plus the two already committed to Eisenhower—would give Eisenhower 30 new votes compared with Taft's two. The results are not binding on delegates and the voters must write in their preference. The state's attorney general ruled nicknames like "Ike" and "Bob" would count. Basil Brewer, publisher of the New Bedford Standard-Times and

state campaign manager for Taft, claimed a majority for the Ohioan a week ago. He did not make an elective forecast.

DELAWARE
On Wednesday, Delaware Republicans hold a state convention to name 12 delegates. Friday Tennessee's Eighth District Republicans hold a convention to name the state's 20th and final delegate. Up to Monday, Republicans have chosen more than half of their 1,205 national convention delegates, the Democrats slightly more than one-third of their 1,230. Counting Saturday's selections in eight states, the Associated Press tabulation of major delegates stood this way (figures are based on delegates pledged, instructed, favorable or willing to state a first ballot choice, and on candidate concessions): Republicans: Taft 266 (Taft's forces claim more than 300); Eisenhower 233; Harold Stassen of

Minnesota 23; Gov. Earl Warren of California 6; Gen. Douglas MacArthur (who is not an announced candidate) 2.

FLORIDA
Meanwhile, the battle went on for more delegates: Sen. Russell, campaigning in Florida where he is opposed to Sen. Kefauver in the May 6 primary, said at a Tampa news conference that if he were nominated he would not support a Democratic platform that includes any compulsory fair employment practices plank. Kefauver has told Florida Democrats he would support such a plank if it were adopted by the Democratic Convention. The FEPC is one of the bitterest issues, and

highly unpopular in the South. Taft said "control of the air is this country's best method to secure and obtain peace." He made the statement in a television program broadcast from Cincinnati, Dayton and Columbus, Ohio, stations.
