Flood Damage High in Utah

SALT LAKE CITY (AP)—Utah flood damage continued to mount Monday as newly melted snow from record parks in the mountains sent fresh torrents down overtaxed mountain stream beds.

Officials feared that the damage to farmlands and property would be the greatest in the state's history. Utah, Carbon, Juniper, Weber, Cache, Morgan and Salt Lake Counties are bearing the brunt of the floods.

In Salt Lake City an emergency canal was built of sandbags along 13th South Street. But the dike gave way early Monday morning between West Temple and Second West Streets, flooding a new flood of water into an area already inundated.

Police said it may be necessary to evacuate a number of homes in the area.

The diked street, serving as a canal, was intended to carry water through the flood area and into Jordan River. The dikes blocked the city's two main arteries, Main Street and State Street. Through traffic was forced to detour through residential areas.

Water began flowing over the spillway of Mountain Dell Reservoir, in Parleys Canyon, adding to the city's flood danger.

Parleys Creek empties into an underground conduit near the Sugar House business district in Salt Lake City. Officials said the conduit could not carry the full force of the stream. Merchants in Sugar House sandbagged their property in an effort to keep the flow in the streets.

Salt Lake City police said the Parleys Canyon road may have to be closed if water laps over the route. Other streams, rushing down the Wasatch Mountain canyons, are already routing record flood waters into Salt Lake City.

The flood situation was serious in other parts of the state.
