Oregon added to its lead in the Northern Division baseball race Monday while last-place Washington State racked up its second 1952 victory in the loop.

The Ducks downed Washington 5-1 at Eugene for the Huskies' third straight loss of their disastrous Willamette Valley junket. Washington State edged Idaho 1-0 in 10 innings at Moscow.

The four teams play again Tuesday, with Washington and Oregon at Eugene and Washington State and Idaho at Pullman.

Pitcher Don Siegmund limited Washington to six hits and held the Huskies scoreless until the ninth. Singles by Sam Mitchell, Bob Houtreys and Gordy Rodland produced the Huskies' only run.

At Moscow, two southpaws—Rod Krough of Washington State and Harlan Melton of Idaho—pitched scoreless ball for nine full innings. A pinch-hit single by Jim Doyle in the top of the 10th scored Glen Krane with WSC's winning run. Monday's games left Washington and Idaho tied in third place with three wins and four losses each.

A crowd of 4,500 is expected at Salem for the Senators' first game with Lewiston, the league newcomers. A good crowd also will be on hand at Tri-City for the Braves-Spokane Indians clash.

Victoria, the league pace-setter after the first week of play, was scheduled to open at home against Wenatchee Monday night but the game was delayed 24 hours, presumably because of the long trip from Lewiston where the Tynes played Sunday.

Vancouver opened on schedule, however, and handed the Yakima Bears an 8-1 shellacking in the night's only contest. The heavy-hitting Caps scored in every inning but the third and eighth as they rapped 12 hits off two Yakima pitchers.
