## Warren Rated as So-So In Oregon Primary Race

SACRAMENTO, Calif. (AP)—California Gov. Earl Warren's chances in Oregon's presidential primary May 18 are rated only so-so. His backers say he will be doing well if he comes out second, as he did in Wisconsin April 1. The odds-on favorite is Gen.

Congratulations to Clayton Hannon, who came through with the majority of votes in the run-off election yesterday, giving him the title of K.U.H.S. Student Body president for 1952-1953. Not only will Clayton fill this office, but as Klamath Falls will be the host to the Southern Oregon District Student Congress, he will be acting president of this group also. Don Dexter was chosen first vice-president in yesterday's election. All the next year's Student Body officers will be installed this Friday in a regular Student Body meeting in the auditorium.

Jackie Hayden was elected to one of the more important offices in the high school last week; that of Girls' League president. Jackie was chosen from a number of nominees by a secret ballot vote from all the girls in the school.

Shirley Sehorn received a majority of votes to serve as vice-president of the club, and Marlene Howard was elected secretary. It seems as though elections for next year's officers are in this week's highlight, for the National Honor Society held their election yesterday also. Heading up this important group is Lewis Fredrickson, president. Pat Payne is vice-president, Julie Harnden, secretary and Shirley Crawford is treasurer.

The honor group has been busy during this spring season, one of their activities being to usher at several of the senior functions. The Junior girls belonging to the club will usher and serve the Senior banquet.

Each homeroom has been asked to select a candidate from their room to represent them in an election of a track queen. One girl from each of the four classes will be selected from these. The class which sells the most tickets to the track meet, can call their candidate queen.

The vice-president and secretary of every class will be in charge of the selections, and all of the selections must be in before May 1.

Dwight Eisenhower, even though he will not campaign for Oregon's 18 delegates to the GOP national convention. Sen. Robert A. Taft of Ohio is not a candidate in Oregon. However, if a write-in campaign is undertaken in his behalf, Warren might find it difficult to head him. In any event, the California governor probably will put on the most intensive personal campaign of any of the six candidates entered in the Republican primary. He expects to start stumping the state next week.

Aside from Eisenhower and Warren, the ballot will carry the names of Harold E. Stassen, Gen. Douglas MacArthur, Sen. Wayne Morse of Oregon and William R. Schneider of St. Louis. Morse and MacArthur were entered against their wishes. Schneider is not likely to be a factor. So in all probability the race will simmer down to Eisenhower, Stassen and Warren. With the Taft write-in as a definite possibility.

Warren decided to go into Oregon at a time when Eisenhower's presidential plans were not entirely clear. His friends say, however, that most of all he wanted to show that he could get votes outside of California.

The governor similarly entered the Wisconsin primary with Taft as his main opponent. Warren won only six of the 39 delegates—Taft got all the rest—but was immediately tagged as a strong campaigner.

## Russ Release Jap Captives

TOKYO (AP)—The Russians Monday released 47 Japanese fishermen interned in the Kurile Islands since November.

The newspaper Yomiuri said the fishermen, picked up for alleged violation of international fishing regulations, were transferred from a Russian ship to a Japanese patrol boat at sea and then brought to Japan.

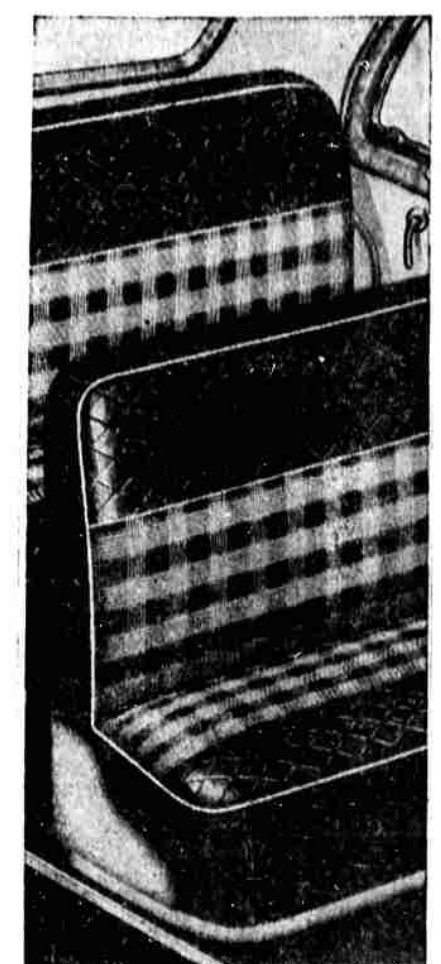

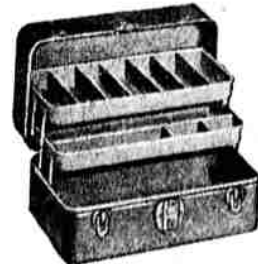
