### Truce Talks in Recess As Reds Study Proposal

MUNHAI, Korea (AP)—Korean truce talks were in complete recess Tuesday for the first time in five months. The United Nations command wanted for Communist reaction to a secret Allied proposal for an armistice. It is up to the Communists to set the date of the next meeting.

### Bad Weather Stops Planes

SEOUL, Korea (AP)—Bad weather grounded United Nations warplanes for the second straight day Tuesday. By mid-afternoon only weather reconnaissance planes got aloft.

There was little action along the 155-mile battleline. Two Red probes on the central front were thrown back early Tuesday.

One involved 12 Reds, the other three squads. U.N. troops repulsed the second group after a hand grenade fight.

B-29 Superforts used electronic techniques in dropping 10 tons of bombs on rail bridges at Bonchon in extreme Northeast Korea Monday night. Two other Superforts hit Communist front lines. B-26 light bombers attacked buildings and highway traffic.

Navy planes and warships pounded both coasts of North Korea Monday. The Battleship Iowa, flagship of the U. S. Seventh Fleet, moved in close to the East Coast and pounded Red positions 17 miles inland.

### Foreigners Asking Aid Amaze Lowell Stockman

WASHINGTON (AP)—Rep. Stockman (R-Ore.), just back from a five-week tour of Pacific and Mediterranean areas said Tuesday he was amazed at the "hand-out" philosophy of nations on the Mediterranean.  
"Every one of them has its hand out to this country," he said in an interview. "They were all appreciative of what we are doing, but not once did I hear anyone express the hope that his country would soon be able to take care of itself."  
The trip, made for the House appropriations committee, took Stockman to the Philippines, Korea and Japan, as well as India, Siam, Egypt, Greece, Italy and Arabia. He returned Monday.  
"They want to make certain we'll elect someone who will continue the foreign aid program," The Oregonian said he was much more encouraged by what he found in Korea.  
"The morale of our troops is high," he reported. "I found no griping from General Van Fleet (U.N. commander in Korea) through the ranks of the G.I.'s."  
He attributed this to the rotation program—"the troops know now that when they've served their time they can come home—there's something to look for."

### Judge Stops Picket Mass

ROCKFORD, Ill. (AP)—Circuit Judge William R. Dusher Monday ordered a halt to mass picketing which has prevented publication of Rockford's morning and afternoon daily newspapers since Friday.

A work stoppage involving members of the Rockford A.P.L. International Typographical Union started March 24.

However, both the Morning Star and the afternoon Register-Republic had published without interruption until Friday, when shoulder to shoulder picketing prevented employees from entering the plant.

Judge Dusher issued a temporary injunction which prohibits mass picketing and limits the number of pickets to six—two at each of three entrances.

The management said no at-

tempt would be made to publish the afternoon Register-Republic Monday, since the injunction was not issued until late in the morning.

Judge Dusher ordered Sheriff Kirk S. King to enforce the injunction order.

Sheriff King told newsmen he had obtained a definite understanding from the ITU that the order would be respected.

King said the order warned that both sides in the dispute must refrain from acts of violence or destruction at the picket line.

The American Newspaper Publishers Association's special standing committee on labor relations, in a report on the strike at the ANPA convention last week said that "the Rockford issue is simply

an ITU demand that publishers grant ITU control over use of outside teletypewriter tape.

"That demand is contrary to Federal law. The Rockford publisher's offer to arbitrate was promptly rejected by the union."

J. H. Ford, secretary-treasurer, Rockford ITU, contends the newspapers "have imported non-union people in the composing room."
