

Japs to Invade Pacific Waters

TOKYO (AP)—Japanese fishermen Wednesday prepared a mass invasion of Northern Pacific waters—Forbidden territory since the war.

Kyodo News Service said about 60 boats are getting ready to leave the Hokkaido port of Hakodate in time to start casting their nets May 12.

On that date the three-way fishing agreement between Japan, Canada and the U.S. becomes effective.

Japanese fishermen were restricted to home waters under the occupation.

U.N. Planes Get 6 MIGs

SEOUL, Korea (AP)—United Nations warplanes Wednesday shot down six Communist MIGs in fighters and damaged four in May Day air battles over North Korea, the U.S. Fifth Air Force announced.

U.S. Sabre jet pilots knocked down the half dozen MIGs and damaged three in a fight just south of the Yalu River border between Manchuria and Korea.

A U.S. Marine Corps plane damaged a MIG in another encounter.

U.N. warplanes swarmed over North Korea on bombing missions in clearing skies. Allied infantrymen tracked themselves on the 13-mile ground front.

Artillery

Communist artillery and U.N. big guns began dueling on the Western front Wednesday at about 8 p.m. (3 a.m. PST). The flashes could be seen from the U.N. Command headquarters camp at Munsan. Red infantrymen jabbed into Allied lines on the Eastern and Central fronts in Wednesday's pre-dawn darkness. They were driven back after a flurry of hand grenade skirmishes.

An Eighth Army officer said the actions were "a little more brisk than usual."

Spring Rodeo Set for Etna

Amateur buckroos of Siskiyou County and Southern Oregon will have a chance to compete in one of the first regularly-scheduled outings of the year next Sunday, the annual spring rodeo at Pleasure Park, Etna, Calif.

Bronc riding, racing, roping and even a packing contest are on the docket for entrants.

The afternoon's activities will start with a parade down Etna's Main street out to the park.

Total entry fees and the added purse will be split on a 50-30-20 basis in major events.

In junior events there will be no entry fees and a \$5 first prize only will be awarded the winners. The events will include musical chairing, spearing, stake race and girls' bareback race.

Youngsters competing in calf riding will get \$2 for their efforts, whether they complete their ride or not.

Directors of the rodeo reserve the right to limit entries in any event, and any event in which there are less than three entries will be cancelled.

A rodeo dance is scheduled for Saturday night at the Etna municipal hall.

Fund Slashes Said Upheld

WASHINGTON (AP)—Sen. Ferguson (R-Mich.), said Wednesday that Senate action on its first two 1953 money bills demonstrates that reductions voted by the House can be sustained and exceeded.

The Senate passed the two measures in a short session Tuesday after cutting them a total of 41 million dollars below the House figures.

The bills now go to conference with the House to adjust the differences. One carries \$3,394,047,000 to run the Treasury and Postoffice starting July 1. The other contains \$1,786,570,000 for Labor and Federal Security agencies.

Amphibious warships and Navy planes pounded North Korea's east coast Tuesday. British carrier-based planes and other Allied naval units attacked west coast targets.

U.S. Fifth Air Force headquarters said United Nations fighter-bombers have changed their routing technique to counter the quick-patch efforts of an estimated 300,000 Communist railway laborers.

A spokesman, acknowledging a switch in track-cutting methods, said the Allied planes will continue round-the-clock blasts at Communist rail and road communications.

"The enemy works hard," he told the Associated Press, "the fighter-bombers work harder."
